

Ship Cambria While Cruising About the Equator

Friday Sept. 27th 1844 All these 24 hours fine trades and pleasant weather by the wind with all sail set so ends. Lat by Obs. 00.20 S Long by Chrt. 176.49

Saturday Sept. 28th 1844 Commences with fine trades and pleasant weather steering by the wind to the S.E. at 6 P.M. tacked ship to the North middle part wind and weather much as the first part at 2 P.M. tacked to the S.E. latter part by the wind to the S.E. fine breezes and pleasant but no Whales so ends. Lat by Obs. 00.59 Long by Chrt. 176.40

Sunday Sept. 29th 1844 Commences with moderate trades at East steering by the wind to the S.E. at 6 P.M. tacked middle & latter part moderate trades from E.S.E. at 11 P.M. kept off North sounds. Lat by Obs. 00.23 S Long by Chrt. 176.34

Monday Sept. 30th 1844 Commences with a light air from the E.S.E. steering N.W. middle part calm latter part a very moderate trade from East steering S.E. so ends. Lat by Obs. 00.20 S Long by Chrt. 176.55

Tuesday Oct. 1st 1844 Commences with a very moderate trade steering to the South West saw Blackfish and Porpoises at 6 P.M. took in the light Sails and luffed to the wind to the North middle part very moderate at day light made sail at 6 wore ship and steered South half part 6 saw Whales a long distance off half part 9 lowered the boats struck 3 Whales saved two but the other by the lines hauled half part 11 took the Whales to the ship got ready to cut so ends

Lat by Obs. 00.35 S Long by Chrt. 177.22 W.



Wednesday Oct. 2nd 1844 Commences with very light trades & part 12 commenced cutting & before 2 finished made all sail by the wind to the S.E. middle part calm at 6 P.M. commenced boiling at 7 took a breeze from E.S.E. latter part standing to the N.E. employed boiling so ends. Lat by Obs. 00.58 S Long by Chrt. 177.21 West.

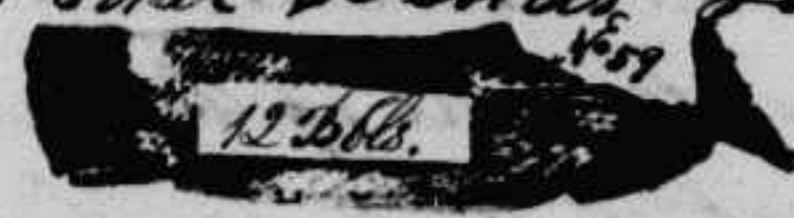
Thursday October 3rd 1844 Commences with moderate trades from the E.S.E. and pleasant steering by the wind to the N.E. at 6 P.M. took in the fore & main Sails & fly jib at 7 finished boiling middle part moderate pleasant at daylight wore ship and made all sail latter part wind and weather much as the fore part Carpenter employed getting out timber for a Cooks Gally so ends. Lat by Obs. 00.55 miles Long by Chrt. 177.23

Friday Oct. 4th 1844 All these 24 hours light air from N.E. steering by the wind to the E.S.E. Carpenter employed on the Gally latter part employed turning up the Starboard Main Rigging so ends.

Lat by Obs. 00.34 South

At 9 P.M. made the dist between the 24th made the log 177.21 Chrt. 177.14 Obs. 58.13

Saturday Oct. 5th 1844 Commences with moderate trades and pleasant steering by the wind to the S.E. at 6 P.M. tacked ship middle part very moderate all sail set at 7 P.M. saw Whales about 3 lowered the boats struck 4 Whales and a calf saved two of the Whales got the Bow Boat stove half part 11 took one Whale to the ship & kept off for the other so ends. Lat by Obs. 00.19 S Long by Chrt. 177.26



Sunday Oct. 6th 1844 Commences with moderate trades and pleasant at 6 P.M. took the other Whale to the ship then commenced cutting at 5 P.M. finished brand full made all sail by the wind to the South East at 6 P.M. shortened sail at 10 wore ship at daylight made sail and commenced boiling at 7 tacked to the E.S.E. latter part fine breezes from N.E. and pleasant so ends.

Lat by Obs. 00.37 S Long by Chrt. 177.25

Monday Oct. 7th 1844 Commences with fine trades and pleasant steering by the wind to the N.W. at 6 P.M. shortened sail half part 6 finished boiling at daylight made sail at 7 tacked took in the Bow Boat latter part Carpenter employed repairing her back trades took in the S.E. Sails so ends. Lat by Obs. 00.14 Long by Chrt. 177.26.
