

Ship Cambria from the North West towards Maui S. Idles

Thursday August 22th 1845 All these 24 hours very moderate trades from N.E. to N.W. with fine pleasant weather steering S by W and S by W with all sails set so ends

Lat by Obs. 24.45 Long by Obs. 153.45

Friday August 23th 1845 All these 24 hours very light air from N.E. to S.W. with pleasant weather very dark prospects of getting in so ends.

Lat by Obs. 23.51 Long by Obs. 153.59

Saturday August 24th 1845 Commenced with a very light air from N.W. with pleasant weather steering by the watch to the South middle part very moderate wind hauled round to the South to the S.W. latter part a light air from South to S.E. and pleasant so ends

Lat by Obs. 23.25 Long by Obs. 154.06

Sunday August 25th 1845 Commenced with a light air from the S.E. with pleasant weather steering by the wind with the larboard tack aboard middle and latter part light air from S.E. to S.W. and pleasant so ends

Lat by Obs. 22.41 Long by Obs. 154.16 West.

Tuesday August 26th 1845 Commenced with light air and calm middle part a moderate breeze from the S.E. and pleasant steering S.E. at 9 P.M. made the East end of Maui bearing S by W by Compass Dist 60 miles latter part very moderate steering by the wind heading S by W off S.W. the topmast and top gallant standing sails so ends

Lat by Obs. 21.48 Long by Obs. 153.50

Wednesday August 27th 1845 Commenced with a moderate breeze from the E. to W. steering in for the Lead at 4 P.M. kept off S.W. for the passage steered that course through the night with a light breeze latter part sent the anchor got the anchors made about 12 but the Trades so ends.

Thursday August 28th 1845 Commenced with a calm half 2 P.M. took the sea breeze steered in for the Lagoon half past 3 came too in 15 fathoms of water gave the ship 50 or 60 fathoms of Chain and furled the sails middle part calm latter the same sent a raft of cork on shore for water let one Hatch go on liberty so ends

Friday August 29th 1845 All these 24 hours fine pleasant weather took off the raft of water and sent another of cork. Blacked the Bends one side Discharged from the ship two Natives of Maui. Shipped one man by the name of John More an American so ends the Hatch on liberty.

Saturday August 30th 1845 All these 24 hours pleasant weather Blacked the Bends the other side shipped another man by the name of William Timmerick an American. one watch on liberty as usual so ends.

Sunday August 31th 1845 All these 24 hours pleasant the watch on liberty as usual so ends.

Monday Sept. 1st 1845 All these 24 hours pleasant weather watch on liberty as usual variously employed on board so ends

Tuesday Sept. 2nd 1845 All these 24 hours pleasant took off our bread that I kept here on storage shipped another man a Spaniard by the name of Jose. Discharged John Honey one of my Boatstewers on account of being a cripple promoted Charles E. King to his station watch on liberty as usual so ends

Wednesday Sept. 3rd 1845 All these 24 hours pleasant the watch employed stowing water and getting of vegetation the other watch on liberty as usual so ends

Thursday Sept. 4th 1845 All these 24 hours pleasant employed as the day previous so ends

Friday Sept. 5th 1845 All these 24 hours pleasant took off all our water and vegetation so ends.
