

Ship Cambria from Maui bound on a Cruise

Friday Sept. 19th 1845 Commences with a moderate trade from the S.E. with pleasant weather steering by the wind with the Larboard tack aboard middle part nearly calm latter part a moderate trade from the S.E. and pleasant so ends Lat by Obs. 5.50 N Long by Obs. 160.12

Saturday Sept. 20th 1845 Commences with a light air from the Eastward with pleasant weather steering S.W. by S. Blackfish middle part light air and calm latter part a moderate trade employed wetting Hold and fixing new fore top sail square block straps so ends Lat by Obs. 2.30 N Long by Obs. 160.45

Sunday Sept. 21st 1845 All these 24 hours moderate trade from the North East with fine pleasant weather steering S.W. with all sail set saw Porpoises several Lat by Obs. 1.15 N Long by Obs. 161.30

Monday Sept. 22nd 1845 Commences with a moderate trade from the N.E. with pleasant weather steering S.W. by S. middle part with the same latter part wind at East steering S.W. by S. employed scowering off the rust off the ship so ends Lat by Obs. 00.09 S Long by Obs. 162.25

Tuesday Sept. 23rd 1845 Commences with a moderate breeze from the Eastward steering S.W. by S. middle part steering S.W. and S.W. by W. latter part steering West and W. by N. employed painting ship out side and painting spars &c. No observation (by & through neglect)

Wednesday Sept. 24th 1845 Commences with moderate trade and pleasant weather steering S.W. by S. employed painting ship and spars at 5 P.M. hauled the ship up West middle part wind and weather much as the first part a great many Porpoises round the ship latter part a fine trade steering W. employed painting spars &c. so ends Lat by Obs. 01.50 S Long by Obs. 162.39 by aneroid 162.55 by aneroid 162.75

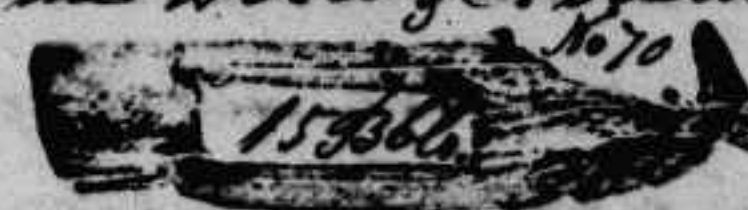
Ship Cambria While Cruising About the Equator

Thursday Sept. 25th 1845 Commences with moderate breeze from the East and with pleasant weather steering N.W. by W. middle part steering N.W. by W. some showers of rain half past 6 S.W. saw Whales to the Eastward luffed the ship to the wind at 8 lowered the boats struck and killed 3 Whales one of them sunk saved 2 took them to the ship at half past 10 commences cutting at 12 finished kept off S.W. by W. made sail so ends Lat by Obs. 00.34 Long 163.14



Friday Sept. 26th 1845 Commences with a light trade from the Eastward steering to the S.W. at 3 P.M. luffed to the wind at 6 P.M. took in the light sails middle part light air and calm with showers of rain at daylight made sail and commences boiling stood to the South half past 10 S.W. saw Breaches kept off for them set the Main Royal about 12 could see that they was Whales chooled down the Jy works got the boats all ready to lower so ends Lat by Obs. 1.04 South

Saturday Sept. 27th 1845 Commences with moderate trade and pleasant half past 12 lowered the boats for the Whales struck one and killed him and drowned another about 2 took the Whale to the ship then kept off for the other boats that was in chase of the Whales commences boiling again at 4 the boat returned without success hooked on to the Whale and cut him in at 5 finished at 9 finished boiling the two first Whales middle part calm latter part a moderate trade and pleasant with black fish and Porpoises wet the Hold &c. so ends Lat by Obs. 00.55 Long 163.46



Sunday Sept. 28th 1845 Commences with a moderate trade half past 12 hauled up the Main Sail & commences boiling at 4 P.M. tacked to the South at 8 finished boiling half past 1 S.W. tacked to the North at daylight made all sail latter part vary moderate with fine pleasant weather so ends Lat by Obs. 10.42 S Long by Obs. 163.55 West
