

Ship Cambria While Cruising in the South Pacific Ocean.

Saturday Decr. 27th 1845 All three
24 hours light air from the S.E. and pleasant first part
standing to the North all sail set middle part standing to the
South under 3 Top Sails latter part all sail set second
Lat by Obs. 24.56 S Long by Chrt. 179.25 West

Sunday Decr. 28th 1845 All three
24 hours light air from the S.E. with pleasant weather steering
by the wind to the S.W. first and latter part under all sail from
middle part under 3 Top Sails latter part see Porpoises sounds
Lat by Obs. 25.34 S Long by Chrt. 179.50 West

Monday Decr. 29th 1845 Commences
with a strong light air from the Eastward with pleasant weather
steering by the wind to the South at 7 P.M. shortened Sail
middle part very moderate at day light made sail
at 8 A.M. tacked to the N.E. latter part employed with up
the lower rigging sounds Lat by Obs. 25.50 S Long by Chrt. 179.32

Tuesday Decr. 30th 1845 Commences
with a very light air from the S.E. with pleasant weather
steering by the wind with the starboard tacks aboard
at 7 P.M. shortened Sail middle and latter part calm
latter part employed fitting new Jib & Eyes saw Porpoises
and Killers so ends. Lat by Obs. 26.13 South.

Wednesday Decr. 31st 1845.
Commences with a calm with pleasant weather middle
part much the same at 8 A.M. took a breeze from the N.W. kept
the Ship S.E. & made all sail at half past 10 saw Whales bearing
S by E kept the Ship for them so ends Lat by Obs. 26.51 Long by Chrt. 179.50

Thursday January 1st 1846 Commences
with a moderate breeze from the N.W. and pleasant half past 12 lowered for
the Whales after chasing 5 or 6 miles struck a large & calf seized the cow by the

past 6 shortened Sail middle part moderate at day light made sail
latter part fine breeze from S.W. with smoky weather took in
the Fore Boat and Kail's bar a little and put her out again painted
the other three Boats so ends Lat by Obs. 26.50 Long by Chrt. 179.50

Saturday Jan 3rd 1846 Commences with
a brisk breeze from the S.W. with pleasant weather steering by the wind
with the starboard tacks aboard at 8 P.M. kept off S.E. half past 6
shortened Sail middle and latter part moderate breeze and pleasant
Porpoises sounds Lat by Obs. 26.51 Long by Chrt. 179.65 West.

Sunday Jan 4th 1846 Commences with
a light air from the S.E. steering N.W. & E.N.E. at 8 P.M.
tacked to the S.W. half past 8 shortened Sail middle and latter
part light air and calm saw Porpoises & Grampous sounds.
Lat by Obs. 26.28 South.

Monday Jan 5th 1846 Commences
with a light air from the South steering South at 7 P.M. shortened
Sail middle part moderate breeze standing to the Westward at day
light made sail half past 5 kept off S.E. latter part brisk wind
from the N.W. with fair weather so ends.
Lat by Obs. 27.20 S Long by Chrt. 178.40

Tuesday Jan 6th 1846 Commences
with the brisk winds from the Eastward and equally took in the
S.P. Sails shortened the Fore & Main Top Sails steering S.E.
middle part very moderate at day light made sail latter part
brisk winds at 10 A.M. saw Sunday Island bearing S.E. about
30 miles Lat took in the Fore & Main Top Sails so ends
Lat by Obs. 28.56.
