Tuesday March 31st 1846 Commenced with a brisk wind from E. S. E. with a heavy head sea single reefed top sails. Fly Spunkies set at 5 P.M. let herse out set the M. T. S. E. middle part more moderate wind from S. S. E. steering E. by N. at daylight set the Main Royal at 7.15 the top on set & Home & Main T. S. E. at 11 set the Lower S. E. latter part moderate breeze from S. S. E. to South so ended.

Wednesday April 1st 1846 Commenced with a moderate breeze from the South steering E. by N. & N. E. middle part more moderate wind from South to West at 5 P.M. shifted over the standing sails latter part a fine breeze at 10 P.M. with cloudy weather so ended. No Observation Sun Observed Lat by Obs 52.30 Long by Obs 114.7

Thursday April 2nd 1846 Commenced with a brisk wind from N. W. W. with cloudy weather steering E. by N. & N. E. with all drawing sail set at 5 P.M. halled in the Lower standing sail middle part more strong breeze veered to West latter part wind at West and more moderate set the S. E. standing sail thick foggy weather. No Observation.

Friday April 3rd 1846 Commenced with a brisk wind from West with cloudy weather steering E. by N. & N. E. with all drawing sail set middle part much the same latter part a very light air gradually halling round to the North cloudy weather. No Observation ended Lat by Obs 52.30 Long by Obs 96.3

Saturday April 4th 1846 Commenced with a light air from the North with thick rainy weather at 1 P.M. halled in the Lower standing sail at 6 P.M. halled in all the S. E. sail at 7 took in the M. T. S. E. middle part fresh winds from N. E. to N. W. took in the T. S. E. Fly S. E. put 2 reefs in the top sails the E. and S. E. latter part a gale from N. E. as usual with a change of Main took in the Fly & Spunkies so ended. No Observation.

Sunday April 5th 1846 Commenced with a gale from the E. S. E. with thick rainy weather standing to the S. E. at 5 P.M. took in the Main sail at 6 veered ship's main part more calm thick and rainy at 7 P.M. let the reef out of the Home & Main top sails latter part light breeze from E. S. E. to N. W. E. half past 11 veered ship to the East thick rainy. No Observation.

Monday April 6th 1846 Commenced with a very light air from the N. N. E. with thick weather at 5 the fog lighted up sun wind veered to N. W. kept the Ship E. N. E. set the S. E. a heavy sea from E. S. E. middle part moderate wind halled round to its old corner E. N. E. at half past 2 P.M. wore ship latter part the wind halled on stock in the Fly S. E. & S. E. cloudy weather so ended. No Observation Sun Observed.

Tuesday April 7th 1846 Commenced with a brisk wind from E. by N. and blowing on put 2 reefs in the top sails at 4 P.M. took in the Fly & Spunkies at 5 took in the Main sail at 6 the Fore sail middle part with gale with thick weather latter part moderate made sail. this is what I call hard blowing nothing but head winds and rain & fog and how long it will last god only knows but I hope not much longer for my patience will wear out. No Observation we haven't had any for 5 days.

Wednesday April 8th 1846 Commenced with light air and calm with a very heavy sea blowing from E. S. E. at 7 P.M. took a light breeze from the Westward made all sail but the wind soon halled round to the North halled in the standing sail at 6 P.M. took in the T. S. E. and Fly S. E. at 8 put 2 reefs in the top sails half past 8 the wind veered to N. W. let the reef out of the Main top sail set the Main T. S. E. sail at 10 took in the M. T. S. E. sail on account of the heavy head sea at half past 11 took in the Fly S. E. & Spunkies and cloudy steering E. N. E. so ended.
