

Ship Cambria from the Curtis Isles towards N Bedford

62 days

Friday April 24th 1846 Commenced with a brisk wind from the S.W. with fair weather steering N by E & E with all drawing sail set middle and latter part moderate so ends Lat by Obs. 41.18 Long by Obs. 43.25

63 Saturday April 25th 1846 Commenced with a brisk wind from the S.W. with pleasant weather steering N by E & E at 3 P.M. crossed the Fore Royal Yard at the Sail middle part very strong winds from S.W. at 6 A.M. sent down the Main Royal Yard fore & air the sail at 10 A.M. but a new Topmast Standing Sail set on the Starboard side shifted the Fore Top Gallant Standing Sail aft on the Starboard side at 12 crossed the Main Royal Yard at the Sail so ends Lat by Obs. 34.51 Long by Obs. 41.55

64 Sunday April 26th 1846 All the 24 hours moderate breeze from South with fine pleasant weather steering N by E & E with all drawing sail set so ends. Lat by Obs. 37.14 Long by Obs. 41.10

65 Monday April 27th 1846 Commenced with a light air from the South steering N by E & E at 8 P.M. it fell calm at 11 to a breeze from the North strong by the wind to the N.E. latter part a brisk wind from N.N.W. to N.W. pleasant weather so ends Lat by Obs. 36.25 Long by Obs. 39.50

66 Tuesday April 28th 1846 Commenced with a brisk wind from the N.N.W. with fair weather steering by the wind with the larboard tack aboard and all sail set. Wind died away in the middle latter part wind from N.W. and increased sun took in the Fore & Main & G.S. and the 1st so ends. Lat by Obs. 34.49 Long 38.00

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67 Wednesday April 29th 1846 Commenced with a brisk wind from the S.W. with fair weather steering by the wind to the N.W. at 2 P.M. took in the 1st & 2nd put one reef in the Main Top Sail at 3 put 2 reefs in the Fore & G.S. at 4 put 2 reefs in the Main middle part moderate breeze reef out of the Top Sails latter part made all sail so ends Lat by Obs. 33.19 Long by Obs. 36.35

68 Thursday April 30th 1846 Commenced with a brisk wind from the S.W. with fair weather at 2 P.M. took in the Fore & G.S. and the 1st at 4 took in the Main & G.S. at 7 took in the Main middle part the wind increased to a Gale took in the Main Sail. 1st put 2 reefs in the Top Sails at 9 A.M. the wind came out from the S.W. in a squall squatted away the spars kept the Ship South at the reef out at 11 at 11 set the Topmast Standing Sail at 12 set the 1st & 2nd so ends Lat by Obs. 31.34 Long by Obs. 35.15

69 Friday May 1st 1846 Commenced with a brisk wind from the S.W. steering S by E at 3 P.M. crossed the Main Royal Yard at 4 set the Lower Standing Sail middle part brisk breeze and fair weather latter part wind at South set a Main Standing Sail so ends. Lat by Obs. 24.50 Long by Obs. 35.10

70 Saturday May 2nd 1846 Commenced with a moderate breeze from South steering N by E all hands variously employed middle part a fine breeze from S.W. to East latter part a very light air from E.N.E. to N.E. with fine pleasant weather so ends. Lat by Obs. 26.50 Long by Obs. 34.48

71 Sunday May 3rd 1846 Commenced with a light air from the North steering by the wind to the Westward saw a beffel to the N.W. middle part brisk wind at 6 A.M. tacked to the N.E. latter part a moderate breeze from N.W. fine pleasant weather so ends. Lat by Obs. 26.12 Long by Obs. 35.59.11
