

Ship Cambria from the Curtis Isd towards N Bedford.

Monday May 4<sup>th</sup> 1846 Commences with a moderate breeze from the NW with pleasant weather at 5 P.M. the wind bore a little to the Westward kept the Ship NNE at the Fore topmast Forey Main & Standing sails middle part wind still more to the Westward set Lower standing sail & Main topmast standing sail latter part wind from the SE shifted over the standing sails a Brig in sight steering N.E. so ends.  
Lat by Obs. 24.15 Long by Obs. 58.25

Tuesday May 5<sup>th</sup> 1846 Commences with a brisk wind from the S.E. with fair weather steering N.E. by N with all sail set middle and latter part moderate breeze and squally with rain heading from N.E. by N to South so ends.  
Lat by Obs. 22.24 Long by Obs. 55.40

Wednesday May 6<sup>th</sup> 1846 Commences with a moderate breeze from the N.E. with pleasant weather middle part a moderate breeze from NNE to NNW at 12 midnight tacked to the E. latter part a moderate breeze from the N.N.W. with fine pleasant weather employed plaining the deck and getting rigging ready.  
Lat by Obs. 21.28 Long by Obs. 54.40

Thursday May 7<sup>th</sup> 1846 Commences with a moderate breeze from the North with fair pleasant weather all hands employed on sundry jobs steering by the wind heading up N.E. and off E.N.E. middle and latter part much the same latter part took up sum of our Store to overhaul it but found it in good order steered it back again a Brig in sight standing the same as ourselves so ends.  
Lat by Obs. 20.45 Long by Obs. 52.08

At 2 P.M. was the Dist between Long 55.59 by Obs. 55.12

Friday May 8<sup>th</sup> 1846 Commences with a very light air from the North steering by the wind to the E.N.E. middle part much the same latter part a moderate breeze from the N.E. steering by the wind to the N.N.W. 2 Brigs in sight so ends  
Lat by Obs. 20.17 Long by Obs. 51.30

Saturday May 9<sup>th</sup> 1846 Commences with a moderate breeze from the N.E. with pleasant weather steering by the wind to the N.N.W. middle part much the same latter part wind from N.N.W. so ends.  
Lat by Obs. 19.00

Sunday May 10<sup>th</sup> 1846 Commences with a moderate breeze from N.E. to North with fair weather at 5 P.M. tacked to the Eastward at 9 tacked again to the N.N.W. middle part moderate latter part light air and calm with rain squalls. No Observation.

Monday May 11<sup>th</sup> 1846 Commences with a calm at 2 took a light breeze from N.E. stood to the NW at 4 P.M. sent a boat to a Brig that was in sight it proved to be the Adorno of Dundee in Scotland 50 days from Cadix bound to Montevideo middle and latter part light air and calm with pleasant weather so ends.  
Lat by Obs. 18.12 Long by Obs. 50.11

Tuesday May 12<sup>th</sup> 1846 Commences with a light air from the E.S.E. steering to the N.E. at 1 P.M. set the Fore topmast standing sail kept the Ship N.E. by N middle part a very light air set the Fore & Main T Gallant Standing Sails at 7 P.M. took a breeze from E.S.E. kept the Ship N.E. with the Main topmast and lower standing sails latter part moderate breeze from E.S.E. with fair weather employed pulling up the topmast rigging so ends.  
Lat by Obs. 16.58 Long by Obs. 50.53
