

Ship Cambria from the Curtis Isles Towards N. B. via Bernandus

[81 days]

Wednesday May 13th 1846

Commenced with moderate trade from the S.E. steering N by E & middle part wind from S.E. to E with showers of rain latter part squally with strong winds with rain so ends

Lat by Obs. 14.58 Long by Obs. 34.02

Thursday May 14th 1846 All there

24 hours moderate trade from East to E & S steering N.E. & with all drawing sail set in ploged Rattling up the topmast rigging so ends.

Lat by Obs. 15.02 Long by Obs. 33.58

Friday May 15th 1846 All there

24 hours light baffling wind with showers of rain one vessel in sight to the N.E. so ends.

Lat by Obs. 11.43 S Long by Obs. 33.50

Saturday May 16th 1846 All there

24 hours daylight air from the E.N.E. with pleasant weather steering by the wind to the North so ends.

Lat by Obs. 11.00 Long by Obs. 33.58

Sunday May 17th 1846 Commenced

with a moderate trade from the E. & S. steering N.E. & the Studing Sails latter part wind from S.E. steering N.E. & with all drawing sail set so ends Lat by Obs. 10.00

Monday May 18th 1846 Commenced

with a moderate trade from S.E. & with pleasant weather steering North middle part sun squally latter part the same steering N by E in ploged Rattling up the rigging so ends

Tuesday May 19th 1846 Commenced

with a moderate trade from E & S with fair weather at 12 left off N by E at 4 P.M. made the land a head ^{lost Bernandus} at 7 saw the light middle part lay off and on at 7 took two boats and went on shore left the ship off so ends

Wednesday May 20th 1846

Commenced with a moderate trade ship off and on waiting for the boats at 3 P.M. sent the boats off to get clear of Sun Decker may 29 yellow was forced to stop on shore all night my self could not get away as tacks were seen enough half past 7 started for the ship in a launch got off about 11 discharged her and made all sail to work off shore with a very light trade so ends.

Thursday May 21st 1846

Commenced with a moderate trade from the E & S with pleasant weather working the ship off shore middle part steering N.E. and N by E the wind had to the S & set all the standing sails latter part wind from S.E. steering N by E in ploged taring down the fore and aft stays a whale ship in sight steering North so ends.

Lat by Obs. 8.20 S Long by Obs. 34.11

Friday May 22nd 1846 All there

24 hours moderate trade from the S.E. with fine pleasant weather steering N by E with all drawing sail set to the best advantage first and latter part in ploged taring down and squaring the wires on the rigging so ends

Lat by Obs. 8.40 Long by Obs. 34.35
