Wednesday June 3rd 1846 All these 24 hours moderate trades from N.E. to E.N.E. with fine pleasant weather steering N.W. with all sail set latter part employed getting out water and storing off the main hatchway one keel in sight so ends. Lat by Obs. 15.25 Long by Obs. 47.45

Thursday June 4th 1846 All these 24 hours moderate trades with fine pleasant weather steering N.W. latter part employed painting the ship in side so ends. Lat by Obs. 16.35 Long by Obs. 48.20

Friday June 5th 1846 Commenced with a moderate breeze from the N.E. with fine pleasant weather steering N.W. middle part nearly calm latter part a very light trade from E.N.E. and pleasant employed painting the ship round out side so ends. Lat by Obs. 17.38 Long by Obs. 49.15

Saturday June 6th 1846 All these 24 hours moderate trades with fine pleasant weather steering N.W. latter part employed painting in side a keel in sight a keel so ends. Lat by Obs. 18.42 Long by Obs. 50.20

Sunday June 7th 1846 Commenced with a moderate trade from the N.E. with fine pleasant weather steering N.W. middle and latter part much the same latter part 2 Brigs passed down across our wake steering West so ends. Lat by Obs. 19.50 Long by Obs. 51.45

Monday June 8th 1846 All these 24 hours brisk trades from the E.N.E. with fine pleasant weather steering N.W. with all drawing sail set saw a number of keels so ends. Lat by Obs. 21.42 Long by Obs. 53.00

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Tuesday June 9th 1846 Commenced with a fine trade from the E.N.E. and pleasant steering N.W. middle part much the same latter part very moderate wind from N.W. to N.E. hauled in the lower drawing sail employed painting the keels round the masts and companion way contributing to the hatchways &c so ends. Lat by Obs. 23.02 Long by Obs. 54.20

Wednesday June 10th 1846 All these 24 hours moderate trades from the N.E. with fine pleasant weather steering N.W. with all sail set so ends. Lat by Obs. 24.30 Long by Obs. 55.30

Thursday June 11th 1846 All these 24 hours moderate trades from N.W. to E.N.E. with fine pleasant weather steering N.W. with all drawing sail set latter part a keel in sight to the N.E. steering to the North West so ends. Lat by Obs. 25.20 Long by Obs. 56.45

Friday June 12th 1846 Commenced with a moderate breeze from the N.E. with pleasant weather steering N.W. middle and latter part light air from East to E.N.E. latter part saw a Brig steering by the wind to the North pass about two miles a stern of us so ends. Lat by Obs. 26.27 Long by Obs. 57.42

Saturday June 13th 1846 All these 24 hours light air from N.E. to E.N.E. with fine pleasant weather steering N.W. latter part a ship in sight to the North Boiling so ends. Lat by Obs. 27.35 Long by Obs. 58.45

Sunday June 14th 1846 Commenced with a faint air from the Eastward steering N.W. middle part calm latter part a moderate breeze from the Westward steering by the wind to the North so ends. Lat by Obs. 28.10 Long by Obs. 59.00
