

² Ship Cambria from New Bedford towards the Pacific Ocean

Saturday Jan^y 16th 1847 Commences with a moderate breeze from the N.W. with fine pleasant weather steering E.S.E. middle part the wind increased to a gale took in the N.E.S. put two reefs in the top sail latter part brisk gales from the S.W. with passing clouds employed fitting boats so ends Lat by Obs. 36.21 Long by Obs. 62.00

Sunday January 17th 1847 Commences with a brisk wind from the S.W. with thick weather steering E.S.E. with two reefs in the top sails middle part much the same lat part single reef in the main top sail N.E.S. sail set over it cloudy weather so ends. Lat by Obs. 35.47 Long by Obs. 58.30 by boats

Monday Jan^y 18th 1847 Commences with a brisk wind from the S.W. with cloudy weather at 3 P.M. the changed sudden to the N.W. in a squall took in the main top sail fore sail and put 2 reefs in the main top sail middle part wind from N.W. more moderate set the fore sail latter part moderate breeze so as to set the jib and main sail employed placing our spare spars and lashing them so ends Lat by Obs. 35.10 Long by Obs. 56.55

^{15 Days} Tuesday January 19th 1847 Commences with a moderate breeze from N.E. to East with fair weather steering by the wind with the barboard tacks aboard at 9 P.M. wore ship to the Eastward middle part very moderate breezes from S.E. to S.S.E. latter moderate breeze from South steering East so ends. Lat by Obs. 35.10

Wednesday Jan^y 20th 1847 Commences with a brisk wind from the S.W. with sun rain steering East middle part wind W.S.W. latter part wind from N.W. with sun rain so ends. Lat by Obs. 35.45 Long by Ships Obs. 51.47 by the other 51.38.

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Thursday Jan^y 21st 1847 Commences with a brisk wind from the S.W. with cloudy weather steering E.S. middle part wind from N.W. and more moderate let all the reef out latter part very moderate with thick weather sun rain so ends. No Observations.

Friday Jan^y 22nd 1847 Commences with light airs and calms at 5 P.M. took a breeze from the South during the night it veered to the W.S. and increased to a gale took in the main sail jib & main top sail and put 2 reefs in the fore & main steering E.S. latter part brisk gales at 4 P.M. took in the fore sail lost reefed the fore main top sails so ends Lat by Obs. 36.18 Long by Obs. 46.03

Saturday Jan^y 23rd 1847 Commences with a brisk gale from the N.W. steering E.S.E. at 6 P.M. the wind veered to N.W. and moderated sun set the fore sail middle part brisk gales with fair weather latter part more moderate let one reef out of the fore top sail two out of the main set the N.E.S. brisk winds with fair weather saw a vessel steering to the North East so ends Lat by Obs. 35.54 Long by Tobias Obs. 42.08 by Ashell 42.2

Sunday Jan^y 24th 1847 Commences with a brisk wind from the N.W. with fair weather steering E.S. middle part more moderate let all the reefs out latter part brisk winds at West and pleasant saw two vessels so ends. Lat by Obs. 36.7 Long by Tobias Obs. 38.52 by Ashell 38.44

Monday Jan^y 25th 1847 Commences with a brisk wind from East with fair weather steering S.E. middle and latter part much the same latter part sent the fore top sail up rove all the running rigging, saw a Brig steering to the North East so ends. Lat by Obs. 35.09 Long by Tobias Obs. 35.35.
