

Ship Cambria from New Bedford Towards the Pacific

Friday Feb^y 5th 1847 Commences with a brisk trade from the Eastward with fair weather steering S by W middle and latter part more moderate steering the same build A Blacksmiths Forge so ends.
Lat by Obsⁿ 17° 37' Long by Tobias Obsⁿ 22° 32'

Saturday Feb^y 6th 1847 Commences with a moderate trade from the Eastward steering S by W at 2 P.M. made the Isle Sal bearing S by W by Compass Dist 40 miles it appeared like a small lump but soon showed two or three humps. at 4 P.M. halled up S by E middle part a brisk breeze from NE at 5 P.M. kept off S by W at daylight kept off S by W shifted over the standing sail at 8 made Bonavita bearing N by E latter part steering S by W by W so ends.
Lat by Obsⁿ 15° 54' Long by Tobias Obsⁿ 22° 45' by Hooker 22° 32'

Sunday Feb^y 7th 1847 Commences with a brisk trade from N.E. with fair weather at 2 P.M. made the Island Mayo bearing West by Compass about 35 miles Dist halled up for it at 5 P.M. shortened sail at half past 10 P.M. halled to the S.E. layed off and on through the night at 5 made sail kept off N by N at 8 made St Jago bearing West kept off for it at half past 9 shortened sail headed off shore off the harbor sent a boat on shore remainder part layed off an on so ends

Monday Feb^y 8th 1847 Commences with a brisk trade at 2 P.M. the boat returned with a few oranges which we payed 30 cts per hundred for discharged the boat took her up kept the ship South and made sail middle part very strong trades at daylight it moderated sun set the topmast standing sail latter part light trades and smoky weather a breeze in sight steering S by W so ends Lat by Obsⁿ 11° 55' Long by Tobias Obsⁿ 22° 54'

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Tuesday Feb^y 9th 1847 Commences with a brisk trade from N.E. with pleasant weather steering South middle and latter part more moderate employed fitting our try works and various other jobs so ends Lat by Obsⁿ 4° 58' Long by Tobias Obsⁿ 22° 15' West

Wednesday Feb^y 10th 1847 Commences with a moderate trade from the N.E. with fair weather steering South middle part much the same at 4 P.M. halled in the standing sail and lowered the boats for blackfish exercised the boats crews for an hour or so then returned on board without blackfish kept off South set the sliding sail vary moderate trades from N.E. so ends.
Lat by Obsⁿ 6° 39' Long by Tobias Obsⁿ 21° 49' by Hooker 21° 14'

Thursday Feb^y 11th 1847 All these 24 hours a moderate trade from the N.E. with smoky weather steering South variously employed so ends Lat by Obsⁿ 4° 50' North.

Friday Feb^y 12th 1847 Commences with a light air from the North with showers of rain middle part light airs and calm latter part a moderate breeze at North thick cloudy weather so ends. No Observation 3 vessels in sight

Saturday Feb^y 13th 1847 Commences with a moderate breeze from the N.N.W. with thick weather and rain middle part light airs and calm latter part very light airs and pleasant lowered the boats for blackfish and to exercise the boats crews so ends.
Lat by Obsⁿ 3° 13' N Long by Tobias Obsⁿ 20° 19' West
