

Ship Cambria in the South Pacific Ocean

Sunday April 11<sup>th</sup> 1847 Commences with a moderate breeze from the South with cloudy weather sun foggy steering N by W at 6 P.M. set the main Royal middle part and weather much as the first part latter part vary moderate wind from S E so ends. Lat by Obs. 36.27 Long by Obs. 78.25

Monday April 12<sup>th</sup> 1847 Commences with a moderate breeze from the S E steering N N W middle part much the same latter part fine pleasant weather lashed our Cutting Bannants to the mast head so ends. Lat by Obs. 34.51 Long by Obs. 78.45

Tuesday April 13<sup>th</sup> 1847 Commences with a moderate breeze from S E with pleasant weather steering N N W at 4 P.M. put the Mast Boat out on the Crowes at 5 P.M. made the Islanda Juan Formandez bearing N N W about 40 miles Dist at 6 P.M. halled in the Studing Sail at 9 P.M. luffed to the wind to the N E with the main top sail aback at 12 noon on the other tack at 2 A.M. left off N N W latter part light airs and calm riged out the Top sail Boom so ends Lat by Obs. 33.56 South the Islanda about 11.00

Wednesday April 14<sup>th</sup> 1847 Commences with light airs from the North with fair weather standing to the E N E saw two vessels one to the N W the other to the N E middle part light airs and calm latter part a fine breeze from the N W standing in for the Islands so ends. Lat by Obs. 33.40 South.

Thursday April 15<sup>th</sup> 1847 Commences with a brisk wind from the N W at 3 P.M. took in the S G S halled up the courses luffed too off shear sent a boat in a fishing at 4 they returned with a fine lot of fish stood off to the N N E at 6 don't a reef took in the main so middle part brisk wind and rain at 8 P.M. they were halled to the south and luffed up made all up steering N N W so ends Lat by Obs. 32.36

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Friday April 16<sup>th</sup> 1847 Commences with a brisk wind from the S E steering N N W all sail set middle and latter part steering N N W latter part employed fitting Doors for starboard Bow Boat so ends. Lat by Obs. 30.13 S Long by Obs. 78.21

Saturday April 17<sup>th</sup> 1847 All these 24 hours brisk wind from the S E with cloudy weather steering N N W with all sail set variously employed so ends. Lat by Obs. 27.36 S Long by Obs. 79.10 West

Sunday April 18<sup>th</sup> 1847 Commences with a brisk wind from the S E with cloudy weather steering N N W middle part wind and weather much the same steering N by W at 4 P.M. saw Black Fish luffed to the wind & down Boat caught one at half past 4 took up the Boat steered N by S until we got the Black Fish then we were round steered N N W half past 10 saw a large Porach or thought we did steered for it about an hour and half but saw nothing suppose it to be the Sun shining on the water through the clouds so ends. Lat by Obs. 24.54 Long 79.30

Monday April 19<sup>th</sup> 1847 All these 24 hours moderate trades from S E to S by E steering N by W & N N W latter part employed fitting Snow Boat so ends with cloudy weather No Observation.

Tuesday April 20<sup>th</sup> 1847 Commences with a moderate breeze from the S E with cloudy weather steering N by W at 4 P.M. put a new Boat out on the starboard Quarter put the Old Boat on the starboard bow middle and latter part light breezes from E S E to S E with cloudy weather steering N by W so ends. No Observation
