

Ship Cambria in the South Pacific Ocean

Wednesday April 21st 1847
Commenced with a moderate trade from the S.E. steering N by W on bent the Fore-top Sail and jib repaired the old ones and bent them in their places, middle and latter part fine trades from E.S.E. to S.E. with cloudy weather steering N by W saw fin backs so ends No Observation.

Thursday April 22nd 1847
All these 24 hours moderate trades from the S.E. with cloudy weather steering N by W latter part employed breaking out our Bread & Flour and Coopering it so ends.
No Observation Sun Obscured

Friday April 23rd 1847 Commenced with moderate trades from the S.E. with cloudy weather middle part much the same latter part fine pleasant weather saw a vessel to the Eastward of us so ends.
Lat by Obs. 15° 19' S Long by Chrt. 74° 56'

Saturday April 24th 1847 All these 24 hours fine trades from the S.E. with cloudy weather steering N by W saw a fin back and call latter part saw a shoal of Black fish going quick to the S.E. so ends.
Lat by Obs. 12° 46' South.

Sunday April 25th 1847 Commenced with a fine trade from the S.E. with cloudy weather steering N.W. middle part much the same latter part very moderate pleasant weather at 7 A.M. saw a Cormorant Bird standing to the S.W. at 9 saw Black fish lowered the Boats for them but could not get near them half past 10 took up the Boats kept off N.W. and steered so with a light trade so ends Lat by Obs. 11° 15' Long by Chrt. 81° 45'

Monday April 26th 1847 All these 24 hours fine trades from the S.E. with cloudy weather steering N.W. latter part middle stitched the S.T. Sail and painted the Starboard and Waist Boats so ends.

Lat by Obs. 9° 41' Long by Chrt. 82° 45' West

Tuesday April 27th 1847 Commenced with brisk trades from the S.E. with cloudy weather steering N.W. middle part much the same latter part more moderate employed repairing up an Old Fore Sail. Painting the har-board quarter and Bow Boats at half past 11 set the Top-mast standing sail saw a shoal of Black fish going quick to the windward so ends.

Lat by Obs. 7° 53' South

Wednesday April 28th 1847
First part of these 24 hours moderate trades with cloudy weather steering N.W. middle part much the same latter part pleasant took up a few Bbls of our New Bay to see if it needed any more salt added to it found it did not stand immediate want so stowed off again saw fin backs so ends Lat by Obs. 6° 12' Long by Chrt. 85° 45'

Thursday April 29th 1847
Commenced with a moderate trade from the S.E. with pleasant weather middle part sun sailing latter part more pleasant saw Black fish and Porpoises so ends.
Lat by Obs. 5° 08' Long by Chrt. 86° 42'

Friday April 30th 1847 Commenced with a moderate trade and smoky weather steering N.W. middle part much the same at 1 P.M. lowered down a boat to try for a Black fish but they were as well as hales returned in half an hour without success latter part moderate smoky weather so ends Lat 4° 08' Long 88° 05'
