Monday May 10<sup>th</sup> 1847

All these 24 hours moderate trades with smooth weather steering WSW latter part saw Porpoises Carpenter employed making a Potatoe pen under the House so ends Lat by Obs. 00.09 Long by Alt. 86.30

Tuesday May 11<sup>th</sup> 1847

All these 24 hours vary moderate trades with thick weather steering SW Carpenter employed as above so ends. Lat by Obs. 00.13 Long by Alt. 97.42

Wednesday May 12<sup>th</sup> 1847

All these 24 hours light airs and calm steering SW and S by W Carpenter employed as above so ends. Lat by Obs. 00.30 Long by Alt. 98.50

Thursday May 13<sup>th</sup> 1847

Commences with a light air from the NE steering SSW middle part wind at East latter part wind from ESE saw a Ship steering by the wind to the N.E. latter part fine pleasant weather Carpenter employed as above so ends. Lat by Obs. 00.37 Long by Alt. 94.20

Friday May 14<sup>th</sup> 1847

Commences with a moderate trade and pleasant steering SW saw a fin back middle part vary moderate steering S by W latter part a fine breeze and as pleasant as day so ends. Lat by Obs. 1.08 Long by Alt. 99.25

Saturday May 15<sup>th</sup> 1847

All these 24 hours moderate trades with fine pleasant weather steering WSW and W by S saw Porpoises a fin back and black fish Carpenter still employed on the House so ends. Lat by Obs. 1.17 Long by Alt. 101.05

Ship Cambria While Cruising About the Equator

Sunday May 16<sup>th</sup> 1847

Commences with a moderate trade from the Eastward with fair weather steering N by W middle and latter part much the same so ends. Lat by Obs. 00.37 Long by Alt. 102.18

Monday May 17<sup>th</sup> 1847

Commences with a moderate trade and pleasant steering N by W at 6 P.M. kept off W by S middle part hauled one of the Chane Cables on deck and commenced mending the rest of it at 10 P.M. saw Whales 1st part 10 lowered the boats and chased the remainder part of the 24 hours so ends. No Obs. boats off after Whales

Tuesday May 18<sup>th</sup> 1847

Commences with a moderate trade and fair weather boats off in chase of Whales started at three or 4 times but they were just out of reach at 7 P.M. the boats returned without success shortened sail for the night stood by the wind to the NE at 12 midnight reared Ship at daylight made sail at 7 P.M. Ship steered NW latter part fine trades and pleasant employed clearing the Chane Cables so ends. Lat by double Alt at 2 P.M. 00.52 Long by Alt. 104.50

Wednesday May 19<sup>th</sup> 1847

Commences with a fine trade from the SE with fair weather steering NW at 6 P.M. finished the Chane and stowed it in the Pen took in the light Sails hauled up the Courses luffed to the wind to the NE at 4 P.M. wore Ship to the South at daylight made sail at 7 kept off W by S latter part fine pleasant weather Carpenter employed building another Potatoe Pen on the other side so ends. Lat by Obs. 00.46 Long by Alt. 104.00
