

30 Ship Cambria While Cruising About the Equator

Monday June 1st 1847 All these 24 hours
vary moderate trades with fine pleasant weather steering
S.W. by W and W.S.W. with all sail set so ends.
Lat by Obs. 10.10 S Long by Obs. 118.10

Tuesday June 2nd 1847 Commences
with a very light air from the Eastward steering W.S.W.
at 9 P.M. spotted the Ship Chimney of the Bedford 11 months
out 750 Bbls of Spermin. at 1 P.M. parted with her and
steered of W.S.W. latter part moderate trades steering
W.S.W. saw Porpoises & Blackfish so ends.



Lat by Obs. 10.18 S Long by Obs. 119.00
Wednesday June 3rd 1847 Commences
with a moderate trade at 1 P.M. lowered one boat for
Blackfish but got nothing as usual took up the boat
kept off W.S.W. middle part fine trade steering W by S.
latter part much the same saw a great many Porpoises
so ends
Lat by Obs. 10.45 S Long by Obs. 120.28

Thursday June 4th 1847 Commences
with moderate trades and thick smoky weather
steering W.S.W. at sunset took in the light sails hauled
up the Courses luffed to the wind to the N.E. with the
Main top Sail aback middle part a fine trade and pleasant
at daylight kept off W.S.W. made sail latter part pleasant
so ends
Lat by Obs. 10.58 S Long by Obs. 120.52

Friday June 5th 1847 Commences
with a moderate trade from the Eastward steering
N.N.W. with all sail set at 6 P.M. took in the Studding
Sail Fore & Main & G.S. hauled up the Courses middle part moderate
pleasant weather steering N.N.W. at daylight made all sail
latter part fine trades from S.E. saw Fin backs so ends.
Lat by Obs. 10.11 N Long by Obs. 121.30

Saturday June 5th 1847 Commences
with a moderate trade from the S.E. with pleasant weather
steering N.N.W. at sunset shortened sail for the night and
luffed to the wind to the South middle part moderate at daylight
made sail latter part vary moderate steering S.W. saw Fin backs
so ends
Lat by Obs. 10.16 S Long by Obs. 121.40

Sunday June 6th 1847 Commences
with moderate trades and pleasant steering S.W. by W at 6
P.M. kept off W.N.W. shifted over the Studding sail set the
Main Royal middle part moderate at daylight took
in the M.R. kept the Ship W by S shifted the Studding sail
over latter part brisk trades a Bar in sight to the East
ward steering S.W. at 1 P.M. saw Breacher to the
South luffed for them so ends.

Lat by Obs. 44 miles S Long by Obs. 122.25

Monday June 7th 1847 Commences
with brisk trades with fair weather steering by the
wind to the South saw Breaches to the S.E. a long dist
off saw them at 1 P.M. at 2 and again at 5 then bearing
East and as far off as when we first saw them at sunset
shortened sail for the night at 7 P.M. the Barke Bark
of Warren N.S. 22 months out 1000 Bbls of Spermin reports seeing
Whales 3 days in succession let the Main top Sail lay
aback haling to the N.E. until 3 P.M. then braced full
at daylight made sail latter part brisk trades steering
N.N.W. so ends. Lat by Obs. 10.42 S Long by Obs. 122.09

Tuesday June 8th 1847 Commences
with ~~light~~ moderate trade from the S.E. steering North at sunset
shortened sail kept off N.W. at 3 P.M. luffed to the wind
to the N.E. at daylight made sail at 6 kept off N.N.W.
at half past 9 hauled up S.W. for a Breach which proved
to be a jumper brisk trades and pleasant so ends.
Lat by Obs. 10.8 S Long by Obs. 122.25
