

Ship Cambria from the Marquesas Bound on a Cruise

Sunday July 4th 1847 Commences with brisk trades and fair weather half past 2 P.M. the boats returned with a few Coconuts and one starved guinea pig took up the boats made all sail to the N.W. by N and may this be the last time I ever have an inclination to visit these Islands at 5 halled up N.N.W. at 7 halled up South middle part moderate at 4 P.M. kept off N.N.W. at daylight set the top mast standing sail saw Roberts Islands, one of them bearing N.W. the other N.W. by N kept the ship off for the lee one latter part very moderate at half past 11 sent Mr West in with the boat at 12 the next bluff bore East dist 3 miles so ends.

Monday July 5th 1847 Commences with a moderate trade and pleasant weather at 3 P.M. the boat returned from the shore could not get Hogs without Bread gave them rum and sent them on shore again at 4 P.M. they returned with 7 wild Hogs which cost about 100 lbs of Bread took up the Boat made all sail by the wind to the N.E. by N middle and latter part moderate trades with pleasant weather latter part employed repairing a sail so ends.

Lat by Obs. 6.45 S Long by Obs. 141.03

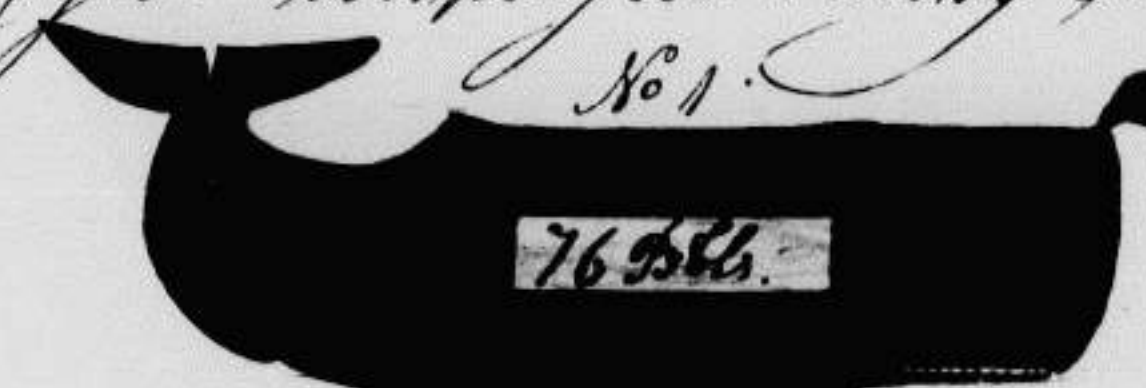
Tuesday July 6th 1847 Commences with a moderate trade from the N.E. steering by the wind with the starboard tacks aboard at 4 P.M. bent a new Main top Sail middle and latter part wind and weather much as the first part steering the same latter part employed mending the Main top Sail so ends.

Lat by Obs. 4.42 S Long by Obs. 142.2

Wednesday July 7th 1847 Commences with moderate trades and pleasant steering North middle part much the same latter part squally with showers of rain took in the J.C. Sails put 2 reefs in the Fore J. S. one in the Main employed setting our Reef & Tack so ends Lat by Obs. 2.28

Ship Cambria While Cruising About the Equator

Thursday July 8th 1847 Commences with brisk trades with fair weather steering N.W. by N employed adding more Salt to our Beef & Pork at 3 P.M. saw Whales breaching at 4 lowered 2 boats the second officer stopped on account having his fingers jammed by a rib of meat at sunset struck and killed a large whale at 7 took him to the ship took in sail middle part brisk trades employed stowing off the after hold and breaking out the masts for water at 8 P.M. got ready for cutting wore ship and hooked on latter part brisk trades and rugged employed cutting so ends Lat by Obs. 2.12 South



Friday July 9th 1847

Commences with brisk trades and fair weather half past 5 finished eating on the J.C. at 8 P.M. started the fire middle part heading to the South with the Main top Sail aback at daylight wore ship latter part brisk trades steering North with double reef top sails fore sail fit of Main Spencer set employed boiling so ends.

Lat by Obs. 1.54 S Long by Obs. 142.49

Saturday July 10th 1847 Commences with brisk trades and pleasant weather steering to the north at 6 P.M. wore ship let the Main top Sail lay aback through the night at daylight wore ship latter part steering N.N.W. employed boiling & cutting junk so ends.

Lat by Obs. 1.17 S Long by Obs. 142.59

Sunday July 11th 1847 Commences with brisk trades and pleasant weather steering N.E. by N at half past 4 P.M. finished boiling at sunset took in the J.C. halled up the Fore Sails & luffed to the wind to the N.E. by N middle part wind and weather much as the first part at daylight kept off N.N.W. let the reef out set the J.C. S. latter part pleasant so ends Lat by Obs. 00.20 S Long by Obs. 143.33
