

Ship Cambria While Cruising About the Equator

Saturday Sept. 18th 1847 Commences with light airs from S.E. and calm heading to the North East middle part light air from N.E. and calm heading to the Eastward latter part a moderate breeze from N.E. fine pleasant weather steering by the wind to the E.S.E. saw Grampoules 20 ends.

Lat by Obs. 00° 26' S Long by Obs. 175° 31'

Sunday Sept. 19th 1847 Commences with a moderate breeze from the N.E. with fine pleasant weather steering by the wind with the larboard tacks aboard and all sail set middle part much the same latter part a brisk breeze from N.E. by E. at meridian tacked to the North 20 ends.

Lat by Obs. 00° 49' S Long by Obs. 174° 48'

Sunday Sept. 20th 1847 All there 24 hours fine trade from the Eastward with pleasant weather steering by the wind with the starboard tacks aboard and all sail set latter part employed setting up Shooks 20 ends.

Lat by Obs. 00° 44' S Long by Obs. 174° 20'

Tuesday Sept. 21st 1847 Commences with a fine trade from the E.S.E. with pleasant weather steering by the wind with the starboard tacks aboard half past 10 P.M. tacked to the South West middle part wind and weather much as the first part at 6 P.M. tacked to the N.E. at 10 tacked to the South latter part moderate trade and pleasant employed setting up Shooks 20 ends Lat 00° 15' S Long by Obs. 174° 28'

Wednesday Sept. 22nd 1847 Commences with a moderate trade from the S.E. with fine pleasant weather steering by the wind to the South half past 1 P.M. saw Whales.

About 2 P.M. lowered the boats after chasing a spell got up pretty handy to one and darted, the Iron struck him in the small to fur left to enter at 5 P.M. boats returned with out success stood to the N.E. at 11 the wind came to the E.N.E. tacked to the S.E. middle and latter part vary moderate 20 ends.

Thursday Sept. 23rd 1847 Commences with a very moderate trade from E.N.E. with fine pleasant weather steering by the wind to the S.E. middle part wind from the N.E. at 8 A.M. tacked to the North latter part brisk breeze from the N.E. with pleasant weather 20 ends Lat by Obs. 1° 05' Long by Obs. 173° 56'

Friday Sept. 24th 1847 Commences with a moderate trade from the N.E. with pleasant weather steering by the wind to the N.N.W. at sunset tacked middle part wind from N.E. to E.N.E. at 6 P.M. tacked to the North latter part wind from E.N.E. to East with a fine breeze and pleasant weather 20 ends.

Lat by Obs. 1° 05' S Long by Obs. 173° 24'

Saturday Sept. 25th 1847 Commences with a fine trade from the Eastward with pleasant weather steering by the wind to the N.N.W. middle part much the same latter a moderate trade from E.S.E. steering by the wind to the South 20 ends.

Lat 00° 55' S Long by Obs. 173° 37'

Sunday Sept. 26th 1847 Commences with a moderate trade from the S.E. with pleasant weather steering by the wind to the South saw Porpoises at sunset tacked to the N.E. middle part moderate trade from the Eastward heading up N.E. and N.E. by E. at 9 P.M. the wind veered to East tacked Ship latter part moderate pleasant weather 20 ends.

Lat by Obs. 00° 43' S Long by Obs. 173° 19'

Monday Sept. 27th 1847 Commences with a fine trade from the Eastward steering by the wind to the S.E. at sunset tacked middle part wind from E.N.E. at daylight tacked at 6 P.M. saw Whales Brea ching about half past 7 lowered the boats struck one saw shortly and killed him chased on after the other whales for an hour or two then struck two more saved one of them cut from the other 20 ends Lat 00° 20' S Long 173° 20'
