

Ship Cambria while at Anchor at Upolu

Sunday 7th 1848 All these 24 hours commences with pleasant weather the Ship, Columbia of Nantucket arrived 21 months out for Apia. no whale latter part filled the tiller put up the round House &c ends

Monday May 8th 1848 Commences with fine pleasant weather employed stowing down water trough out for New. Ship's latter part took of a small raft of water boat the fore & main courses & main & G. sail. Shipped two men 60 Smith and Robert Beach &c ends

Tuesday May 9th 1848 Commences with pleasant weather employed blacking one of our Chances middle part rain about mid night I was called by a Native to go and take two deserters out of a canoe he used down a boat and took them it proved to be Thomas Johnson and Levi Hager latter part got all ready for sea, discharged Joseph Sylva &c ends



Wednesday May 10th 1848 Commences with a moderate trade from the North latter part I went on shore and shipped a man by the name of White at 1 P.M. took our Anchor and stood to sea at 2 P.M. discharged our pilot on board the Chance. Stood over anchors middle part a fine trade with showers of rain latter part light air from N.E. employed getting a new boat and getting the stoves ready blacking the chance cable 10 inds.

Lat by Chron. 12° 23' South.

Thursday May 11th 1848

Commences with a moderate breeze from the North with showers of rain middle part wind much the same but pleasant latter part moderate breeze from N.E. variously employed &c ends

Lat by Chron. 11° 56' Long by Chron. 171° 43'

Ship Cambria from Upolu bound on a Cruise

Friday May 12th 1848 All these 24 hours moderate breeze from the Eastward with pleasant weather steering by the wind with the starboard tacks stowed & all sail set latter part employed making a fly jib boom and repairing the ship's &c ends

Lat by Chron. 10° 05' Long by Chron. 171° 02'

Saturday May 13th 1848 Commences with moderate breeze and pleasant weather steering by the wind to the N.E. at 5 P.M. saw Howditch Island bearing N.W. by E. 10 miles middle part squally rainy weather latter part much the same finished the fly jib boom and rigged it out &c ends

Lat by Chron. 8° 39' South.

Sunday May 14th 1848 Commences with a moderate trade from the Eastward with pleasant weather heading up South off N.W. middle part much the same latter part wind at South very moderate with showers of rain heading to the Eastward &c ends

Lat by Chron. 8° 39' South.

Monday May 15th 1848 First South middle part light air and calm with much rain latter part very moderate breeze from North with fair weather bent the fly jib and set it Carpenter employed making a gangway board &c ends

Lat by Chron. 6° 11' South Long by Chron. 170° 37'

Tuesday May 16th 1848 Commences with a light air from South with pleasant weather steering by the wind to the E.S.E. middle part light air and calm latter part a light air from the South heading North repaired the fore & G. sail &c ends

Lat 6° 00' S Long by Chron. 170° 48'

Wednesday May 17th 1848 Commences with a moderate breeze from the S.E. steering N.E. bent our fore and only main Spencer middle and latter part very moderate latter part employed making a G. sail Carpenter getting out boards to repair a boat &c ends

Lat 4° 25' South
