

## Ship Cambria While Cruising About the Equator

At 2 P.M. the distance between the ship and the land was 171.40.30  
the ship's position 171.40.30

Thursday June 8<sup>th</sup> 1848 Commenced with a brisk trade from the Eastward with pleasant weather  
saw Blackfish middle and latter part both trades and pleasant ends Lat 10° 18' S Long 171° 38'

Friday June 9<sup>th</sup> 1848 All these 24 hours fine trades with pleasant weather steering by the wind middle and latter part all sail set second  
Lat by Chron 101° 07' South Long 171° 39'

Saturday June 10<sup>th</sup> 1848 All these 24 hours brisk trades from the Eastward with showers of rain steering by the wind with the larboard tacks aboard second  
Lat by Chron 101° 46' South Long by Chron 172° 05'

Sunday June 11<sup>th</sup> 1848 Commenced with a brisk trade at East with showers of rain steering by the wind with the larboard tacks aboard middle part the same at 8 A.M. tacked to the North latter part wind and weather the same second  
Lat by Chron 101° 43' South Long 172° 07'

Monday June 12<sup>th</sup> 1848 All these 24 hours brisk trades at East with smoky weather steering by the wind with the starboard tacks aboard second  
Lat by Chron 101° 47' South Long by Chron 171° 50'

Tuesday June 13<sup>th</sup> 1848 All these 24 hours moderate trades from East to ESE with fine pleasant weather steering by the wind with the starboard tacks aboard and all sail set latter part employed getting our cutting pendants  
Lat by Chron 101° 26' S Long by Chron 171° 33'

Wednesday June 14<sup>th</sup> 1848 All these 24 hours moderate trades and pleasant by the wind with all sail set saw Blackfish and Porpoises lashed the cutting pendants to the mast head  
Lat by Chron 101° 26' S Long by Chron 171° 33'

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Thursday June 15<sup>th</sup> 1848 All these 24 hours moderate trades and pleasant weather by the wind with all sail set the first and middle part saw plenty of Black Fish and Porpoises latter part nothing to be seen Lat 10° 48' S Long 171° 46'

Friday June 16<sup>th</sup> 1848 Commenced with moderate trades from the Eastward with pleasant weather by the wind to the S.E. middle part brisk trades with squalls took in the S.G. sail latter part brisk trades with pleasant weather second  
Lat by Chron 103° 37' South Long 171° 37'

Saturday June 17<sup>th</sup> 1848 Commenced with brisk trades and pleasant weather steering by the wind to the SNE middle part more moderate made all sail at 8 A.M. tacked to the South latter part fine trades and pleasant second  
Lat by Chron 103° 30' South Long by Chron 172° 05'

Sunday June 18<sup>th</sup> 1848 All these 24 hours moderate trades from ENE to ESE standing on the tack we can make the most bottom on saw Porpoises  
Lat by Chron 104° 45' South Long by Chron 172° 08'

Monday June 19<sup>th</sup> 1848 All these 24 hours light airs and calm saw a number shoals of Porpoises the current is now taking us off to the Westward at the rate of knots Lat 2° 18' S Long 172° 48'

Tuesday June 20<sup>th</sup> 1848 Commenced with a calm at midday took a breeze from the NE made all sail by the wind to the South East remainder part a moderate breeze from NE to ENE with fine pleasant weather  
Lat by Chron 103° 45' South Long by Chron 172° 41'

Wednesday June 21<sup>st</sup> 1848 All these 24 hours moderate trades with fine pleasant weather first and middle part steering to the South latter part standing to the North Lat by Chron 104° 14' South Long by Chron 172° 38'
