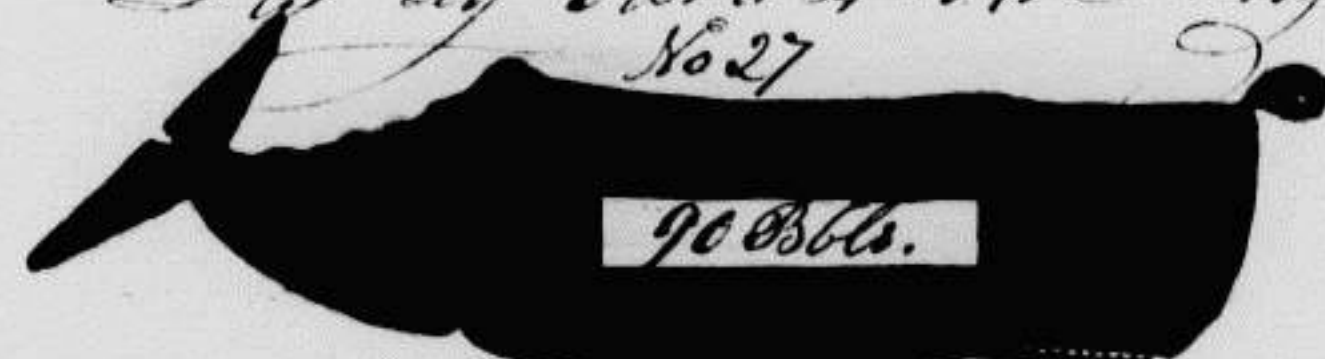


Ship Cambria While Cruising About the Equator

Thursday June 22nd 1848 All
these 24 hours light airs from East to N.E. with some showers
of rain Lat about 2.30 Long about 172.30

Friday June 23rd 1848 Commenced
with light airs and calm. At 3 P.M. saw a large whale toward
the boat for him at half past 3 struck him when he came
up about half past 4 killed him half past 5 took him to the
ship then shortened sail middle part moderate trades got
all ready for cutting half past 6 A.M. commenced latter part
fine trades and pleasant heading on the weather track wind.
Lat by Chron. 4.08 Long by Chron. 172.49
No 27



Saturday June 24th 1848 Commenced
with a moderate breeze from the N.W. at 5 P.M. finished
baling the Case braced full and made sail by the wind to the
Eastward at 8 P.M. commenced boiling middle part moderate
heading up East off Eby S at 5 A.M. made Elizabeth's Island
to the weather of us not more than a mile from us latter part
heading up Eby S employed boiling and pumping salt
water out of our second tier forward filling the Case for 646 needs
Lat by Chron. 4.38 Long 172.00

Sunday June 25th 1848 Commenced
with light airs from the North with pleasant weather middle
part calm at 4 A.M. took a breeze from the S.E. steered by
the wind to the E.N.E. at 10 spoke the Ship Omega of Fair
Haven's men on the out see also saw Sydney's Island bearing
E.N.E. latter part fine trades and pleasant employed boiling and
cutting junk at 12 Sydney's Island bore East Dist about
10 miles Lat by Chron. 4.27 South.



Ship Cambria While Cruising About the Equator

Monday June 26th 1848 Commenced
with moderate trades and pleasant steering by the wind to the N.E.
at 6 run off to the Omega went on board of her and stayed
a spell at 10 P.M. finished boiling at 11 cured 2 Hops at 2 P.M.
were back and set the main sail latter part fine moderate steering
up the fore hold standing wood below in deck at meridian made
Underbury's Island bearing South Lat by Chron. 3.21 South

Tuesday June 27th 1848 Commenced
with a moderate breeze from E.N.E. steering by the wind to the North
at half past 3 kept off and run down under the lee of the Island pulled
in with two boats caught a nipp of fish larvae and got a bucket
of eggs at 8 returned steered by the wind to the S.E. middle part
breeze trades took in the fore & main S.E. sails by 10 at 4 A.M.
tacked latter part trade trades took in the S.E. sail saw Phoenix
Island bearing East towards Lat by Chron. 3.37 Long 171.10

Wednesday June 28th 1848
Commenced with light trades from the E.N.E. with pleasant
weather steering by the wind to the North at 6 P.M. took in the
main sail middle part more moderate at 5 A.M. were still
at 8 set the main sail latter part employed taking up the
Ground Tier on the starboard side of the fore hold put an extra
hoop on it and stowed them back filled them with 646 Underbury's
Island in sight off the lee Lat by Chron. 3.08 South.

Thursday June 29th 1848 Commenced
with a moderate breeze from the E.N.E. at 3 P.M. finished steering off
washed ship at 5 P.M. set the fore & main S.E. sails and by 10 tacked
to the North middle part moderate trades from E.N.E. to E.S.E. and pleasant
latter part wind from E.S.E. Lat by Chron. 3.32 Long 170.41

Friday June 30th 1848 All these
24 hours moderate trades from E.S.E. to N.E. with pleasant
weather steering by the wind with the starboard tack aboard
Lat by Chron. 1.49 Long by Chron. 170.08
