

Ship *Nambra* While Cruising About the EquatorTuesday July 11th 1848

Commenced with a very strong trade with squally weather at 10 P.M. finished sailing at 12 S.W. the main sail at 2 P.M. set the main & sail more moderate at 9 A.M. set the Mizzen & sail and fly jib Lat 10° 42' S Long 171° 25'

Wednesday July 12th 1848 Commenced

with a brisk trade from the Eastward steering by the wind to the South at 3 P.M. spoke the *Omegon* of 4 Haver but when we observed we saw her but he wished me to call on her to see a fish man he had at 4 reported at 6 tacked to the N.E. middle part tacked much as the first part at daylight tacked again latter part brisk trade and pleasant so ends Lat by Obs. 10° 56' S Long by Obs. 171° 22'

Thursday July 13th 1848 Commenced

with a brisk trade steering by the wind heading up S.E. by S middle part heading up S.E. by E. latter part more moderate at 9 A.M. tacked at North at 12 tacked to the S.E.

Lat by Obs. 2° 08' S Long by Obs. 171° 11'

Friday July 14th 1848 All three 24

moderate breeze from E.S.E. to East with pleasant weather latter part employed breaking out an anchor steering West in aft so as to have it handy Lat by Obs. 1° 21' S Long 171° 17'

Saturday July 15th 1848 All three

24 hours light airs from S.E. to E.S.E. with pleasant weather steering by the wind with the starboard tacks aboard

Lat by Obs. 10° 50' S Long by Obs. 171° 03'

Sunday July 16th 1848 All three 24

hours light airs from the E.S.E. with fine pleasant weather first and middle part standing to the N.E. latter part standing to the South so ends. Lat by Obs. 10° 57' S Long by Obs. 171° 27'

Ship *Nambra* While Cruising About the EquatorMonday July 17th 1848 All three 24 hours

moderate breeze with fine pleasant weather Lat by Obs. 10° 57' S Long 171° 20'

Tuesday July 18th 1848 Commenced

with a moderate breeze from the Eastward with pleasant weather steering by the wind with all sail set, middle part the same latter part brisk trade Lat by Obs. 2° 57' S Long by Obs. 171° 18'

Mary IsleWednesday July 19th 1848 Commenced

with a fine breeze from the E.S.E. steering by the wind to the S.E. at 2 P.M. made *Martinez Island* bearing S.W. by W. 12 miles middle part stood at last stand part the night to the N.W. and part to the S.E. latter part brisk trade and squally with showers of rain filled the fore peak with wood seeds.

Lat by Obs. 2° 31' S Long by Obs. 170° 42'

Thursday July 20th 1848 Commenced

with a brisk trade from the Eastward steering by the wind with the starboard tacks aboard stowed a little bit down at 6 P.M. took in the Mizzen & fly jib at 9 took in the main & sail latter part more moderate made all sail easy squally weather Lat by Obs. 10° 50' S Long 170° 58'

Friday July 21th 1848 Commenced

with a moderate breeze with thick squally weather stood to the North until 2 A.M. then went to the S.E. latter part fair weather steering South Lat by Obs. 10° 38' S Long 170° 53' West

Saturday July 22th 1848 Commenced

with moderate breeze with fair weather saw a ship to the Westward by her flag call it the *Omegon* at 6 P.M. tacked to the North at midnight tacked back again middle and latter part fine trade with squally weather Lat by Obs. 10° 57' S Long by Obs. 170° 44'

Sunday July 23th 1848 All three 24 hours

fine breeze with pleasant weather steering by the wind to the South Lat by Obs. 2° 56' S Long by Obs. 171° 00' West.
