

Ship Cambria While Cruising About the Equator.

Thursday August 17th 1848

Commences with a brisk trade from the E. S. E. with fair weather steering S. S. W. at 6 P. M. took in the 4 S. E. S. hauled up the courses and luffed to the wind middle part brist trades at day light 1/2 the courses at 5 kept off S. S. W. at half past 9 A. M. made McKean Island bearing S. W. by S. 115° 12 miles at 12, it bore South East 2 miles so ends Lat 3° 34 South Long 174° 17

Friday August 18th 1848 Commences with

very strong trade from E. S. E. steering N. S. W. by W. M. employed sitting up the fore & aft stays half past 4 luffed to the wind to the North middle and latter part very strong trades so ends

Lat by Chron. 2° 54 Long by Chron. 174° 41

Saturday August 19th 1848 Commences

with very strong trade from the Eastward steering by the wind to the S. S. E. at 6 P. M. reefed the 4th sails middle part more moderate at daylight let the reefs out latter part fine trades and pleasant at 9 A. M. the 16 S. E. S. by 3/4 and prospects so ends Lat 3° 39 Long by Chron. 174° 35 West.

Sunday August 20th 1848 Commences

with brisk trades and fair weather steering by the wind to the S. S. E. at 6 P. M. hauled at 6 P. M. took in the light sails middle part wind and weather much as the first part latter part more moderate saw a shoal of Porpoises so ends

Lat by Chron. 2° 35 Long by Chron. 174° 52

Monday August 21st 1848 All these 24

hours moderate trades with pleasant weather saw Porpoises

Lat by Chron. 2° 14 South

At 10 A. M. made the 1st
between the Sun & Moon made
the Long 174° 58 Chron. East
by Chron. 174° 30 87° 01

Tuesday August 22nd 1848

All these 24 hours moderate trades from East to E. S. E. with pleasant weather half past 9 A. M. saw a large Orca bearing N. W. by W. kept off and run on for it until 12 but saw nothing more

Lat by Chron. 1° 54 Long by Chron. 174° 54

Wednesday August 23rd 1848

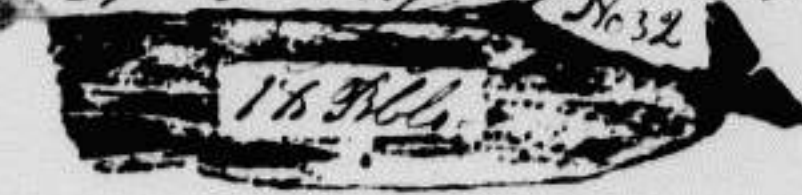
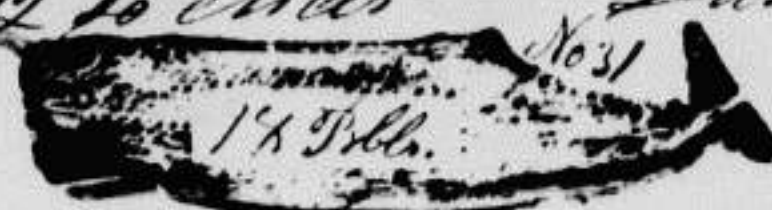
Commences with moderate breeze from E. S. E. with pleasant weather steering by the wind to the N. E. mid part more brist trades same at 4 A. M. reefed ship saw a ship under our lee very handy latter part fine trades and pleasant the above ship standing along after us supposed it to be the Omega words Lat 1° 36 Long 174° 54

Thursday August 24th 1848

All these 24 hours a fine trade from E. to E. S. E. first and middle part steering by the wind to the South at half past 6 A. M. saw Whales bearing East a long distance off 5 or 6 miles to the 3rd in the course of the fore noon but saw nothing more so ends every strong current Lat by Chron. 1° 50 Long 175° 14 West

Friday August 25th 1848 Commences

with a fine trade from the Eastward and pleasant standing to the South at 6 P. M. hauled middle part brist trades took in the 4th sails half past 6 A. M. saw Whales Breaching a head made all sail about 4 got up with them and lowered the boats struck and killed two about 11 took them to the ship got ready to cut & hooked on about 12 so ends Lat by Chron. 1° 31 Long by Chron. 175° 31

Saturday August 26th 1848

Commences with brisk trades and pleasant half past 2 P. M. finished putting aboard full by the wind to the South at 7 P. M. were ship middle part very strong trades at 5 A. M. were round & set the 16 S. E. S. half past 5 commences hoisting at 6 A. M. the 16 S. E. S. and 16 S. E. S. half past 6 the Omega reefed under our lee with all sail out latter part fine trades and pleasant all sail out excepting the main sail so ends Lat by Chron. 1° 56 S. Long 175° 42

Sunday August 27th 1848 First 8

middle part moderate trades from E. S. E. to E. N. E. steering by the wind to the North East at 6 A. M. reefed ship at 9 A. M. finished hoisting set the main sail at 12 A. M. so ends Lat 1° 34 Long 175° 42
