

Ship Cambria While Cruising About the Sydney Group
 Tuesday Feb 5th 1849 Commenced with
 a brisk trade from the N.N.E. with fair weather at 1 P.M. saw Whales
 breaching off our lee half past 3 got up with them and lowered the boats and
 were soon struck and killed 2 Whales half past 5 took them to the
 Ship then were run in to the Eastward and shortened sail middle part
 pleasant got all ready to cut at 8 commenced at 9 finished were round
 to the N.W. made sail saw breakers to the S.W. latter part employed
 clearing away the Heads to ends. Lat by Obs. 3^h 52^m Long 173^o 35^m

Wednesday Feb 7th 1849 Commenced
 with fine trades from the N.E. with pleasant weather at half past 8
 born in next morning at 1 P.M. tacked to the S.E. middle part pleasant
 at 12 midnight wore ship latter part (brisk) trades at 9 AM
 made ~~the~~ ^{Gardner's} Island bearing N.N.W. Dist about 15
 miles at 12 bore N by S Lat by Obs. 4^h 44^m Long by Obs. 174^o 05^m
 Gardner's Is.

Thursday Feb 8th 1849 Commenced
 with a fine trade from the N.N.E. at 5 P.M. were round and steered
 south for the Island half past 3 finished boiling at 5 put the starboard
 boat out pulled in to see if we could land but found we could
 not too much breakers on the Island had the appearance of being
 well wooded and a lagoon nearly the length at 5 took up the boat
 and stood to the N.W. with all sail set middle and latter part fine
 pleasant weather shifted main & sail Lat by Obs. 3^h 52^m Long 175^o 00^m

Friday Feb 9th 1849 Commenced with
 a moderate breeze from the N.E. and pleasant steering by the wind to the
 North at 7 it came up equally from the South which lasted about 2 hours
 then East took in the S.E. after that it cleared off fine wind at East made all
 sail at 6 P.M. tacked latter part moderate trades from N.E. and pleasant
 Lat by Obs. 3^h 52^m Long by Obs. 174^o 45^m

Saturday Feb 10th 1849 All these 24
 hours fine breeze from N.E. to N.N.E. with pleasant weather steering by
 the wind to the Eastward with all sail set. Lat 4^h 13^m Long 173^o 22^m

Sunday Feb 11th 1849 First and middle part
 with trades from N.E. by N steering by the wind to the Eastward all sail
 set latter part moderate trades from N.E. standing to the N.N.W. perches
 Lat by Obs. 4^h 33^m Long by Obs. 172^o 28^m

 Monday Feb 12th 1849 All these 24 hours
 moderate trades from E.N.E. with fine pleasant weather ends.
 Lat by Obs. 3^h 48^m Long by Obs. 172^o 35^m

Tuesday Feb 13th 1849 Commenced with
 a light air from the E.N.E. and pleasant at 4 P.M. saw 2 Whales going
 very quick to the E.N.E. lowered the boats and chased until sunset
 with out success (half past 7) took up the boats middle part light air
 and equally latter part moderate breeze from the North perches
 Lat by Obs. 3^h 37^m Long by Obs. 172^o 45^m

Wednesday Feb 14th 1849 Commenced
 with equally ^{weather} wind from E.N.E. to N.E. caught a Porpoise middle
 part weather much the same latter part fair weather employed
 squaring the deezings on our lower rigging. Lat 3^h 57^m Long 172^o 52^m

Thursday Feb 15th 1849 All these 24
 hours fine trades with fair weather middle part light sails furled
 Lat by Obs. 3^h 58^m Long by Obs. 173^o 00^m

Friday Feb 16th 1849 All these 24 hours
 moderate trades and pleasant weather middle part light sails furled latter
 part repaired the S.E. sail to ends Lat by Obs. 3^h 40^m Long by Obs. 175^o 30^m

Saturday Feb 17th 1849 Commenced
 with moderate trades and pleasant steering by N.N.W. and South
 at sunset took in the light sails main sail and tacked to the west
 to the S.E. middle part pleasant at daylight made sail at 6 light
 off South at 8 wore ship to the N.N.W. latter part fine pleasant
 Lat by Obs. 4^h 04^m Long by Obs. 173^o 47^m

Sunday Feb 18th 1849 Commenced
 with a fine trade and pleasant weather all day out
 middle part light sails furled at 6 P.M. saw 160 Reard Island
 bearing West about 8 miles dist latter part pleasant all sail set
 Lat by Obs. 3^h 13^m

Monday Feb 19th 1849 All these
 24 hours fine trades from the E.N.E. with pleasant weather
 steering by the wind to the North middle part light sails furled
 ends. Lat by Obs. 3^h 45^m Long by Obs. 174^o 59^m
