

Ship Cambria While Cruising About the Sydney Group.

Tuesday Feb 25<sup>th</sup> 1849 Commences with brisk trade from the ENE with fair weather backed and filled until half past 1 for a breeze but saw nothing more then stood to the North until 4 and tacked to the S.E. at 5 P.M. took in the light sails middle part brist trade and fair weather at 7 P.M. took in the main sail latter part saw strong trade bearing up at 8 by 8 Cooper employed on the rigging & rigging made. Lat by Obs. 20.22 S Long by Obs. 174.45

Wednesday Feb 26<sup>th</sup> 1849 Commences with a brisk trade from the ENE with fair weather steered by the wind to the SE until 3 P.M. then was rounded to the North steered by the wind to the North the remainder part of these 24 hours latter part more moderate at the 4 P.M. sails Cooper employed making rigging & rigging made. Lat by Obs. 19.48 S Long by Obs. 175.45

Thursday Feb 27<sup>th</sup> 1849 All these 24 hours brisk trade from the ENE with pleasant weather steered by the wind to the North light sails further made.

Lat by Obs. 19.28 S Long by Obs. 176.14

Friday Feb 28<sup>th</sup> 1849 Commences with a fine trade from the Eastward steering North with a light sail but the main sail at sundown took in the light sails and once ship half past 11 were back at daylight at the light sails saw New Kentucket bearing NW at 4 kept off NWW passed 10 at 10 at to see the Island from deck latter part fine pleasant weather steering NWW employed hatching the topmast rigging Cooper making rigging made. Lat by Obs. 20.01 S Long by Obs. 177.15

Saturday Feb 29<sup>th</sup> 1849 Commences with moderate trade from the Eastward and pleasant steering NWW employed hatching the topmast rigging and tarring down miscella part moderate pleasant weather steering the same latter part steering NWW employed painting the ship out side so ends.

Lat by Obs. 20.38 S Long by Obs. 178.00 West.

Sunday Feb 30<sup>th</sup> 1849 Commences with moderate trade and pleasant steering NWW at 1 P.M. finished painting out side painted the fore sprit, miscella and latter part moderate pleasant steering NWW Lat 2.00 Long by Obs. 179.10 East

Ship Cambria While Working off to the Westward through the Sound Feb 25<sup>th</sup> 1849 Commences

with a moderate trade from the ENE with pleasant weather steering SW middle part steering NWW at 7 P.M. saw Whales a head bracing at 8 got handy enough and lowered 3 boats but did not see the Whales after wards they were going very quick to the Eastward two of them half past 10 boats returned with out see except kept off NWW made all sail employed hatching the top mast rigging made.

Lat by Obs. 20.33 North

Tuesday Feb 29<sup>th</sup> 1849 Commences with a moderate trade from ENE steering NWW at 1 P.M. made Stitches Island bearing NWW did about 20 miles at 5 P.M. luffed to the wind to the North middle part a fine breeze at 2 P.M. tacked to the SE at 10 P.M. kept off NWW employed hatching the lower rigging so ends.

Lat by Obs. 20.38 S

Wednesday Feb 28<sup>th</sup> 1849 Commences with a brisk trade from the ENE at 1 P.M. made Stitches Island bearing NWW at 2 kept for it at 4 the canoes came off to trade through Coconuts and few fowl at 6 the canoes left us stood to the SE until 3 P.M. then tacked to the North at 9 P.M. the canoes again came off to trade for fowl sent a boat on shore side to trade half past 11 the boat returned kept off NWW made all sail brought 41 fowl as many Coconuts as we wanted and 2 Natives so ends.

Lat by Obs. 20.31 South

Thursday Feb 27<sup>th</sup> 1849 Commences with moderate trade and pleasant weather steering NWW half past 3 P.M. saw Whales about 4 lowered the boats sailed down about where we thought they was and happened the Whales came up at once the boats got frightened and started off to the westward shared them off about sunset got up with them and muffed with both boats at 7 boats returned with out see kept stood to the SE until 2 P.M. then tacked to the SW latter part fine pleasant weather finished hatching the rigging. Lat by Obs. 20.07 Long 178.00 East

Friday March 1<sup>st</sup> 1849 All these 24 hours moderate trade and fine pleasant weather all sail set by the wind latter part all hands employed hatching out the fore part for Pipe Smoking Heads saw 2 porpoises so ends. Lat by Obs. 20.00 S Long by Obs. 179.10 East
