

Ship Cambria while working off to the Westward

Saturday March 3rd 1849 All there 24

hours brisk trades from N.E. to South with fine pleasant weather steering by the wind with all sail set Lat 2.05 S Long 172.14

Sunday March 4th 1849 Commences with

moderate trades from the N.E. and pleasant all sail set by the wind middle and latter part the same Lat by Obs. 1.58 S Long 172.39 East

Monday March 5th 1849 Commences

with moderate trades from the N.E. with fair weather all sail set middle part equally raining weather settled all hands but in the fore sail put 2 reefs in the top deck's latter part more pleasant with all sail set Black fish Cooper employed repairs in fore sail Lat by Obs. 1.53 S Long 172.20

Tuesday March 6th 1849 Commences

with moderate breeze from the N.E. with fair weather steering N.W. at 2 P.M. set the topmast standing sail middle part fresh with fair weather until about 4 P.M. it then came up equally both in the light sails at daylight set them again latter part brisk wind from South to N.W. with cloudy weather No Observation seen Observed

Wednesday March 7th 1849 Commences

with brisk winds from the South with fresh weather about 5 P.M. just after a rain shower saw a shoal of Whales ^(have seen 11 Whales 50 or 60) and sent 3 Boats off for them but did not see the Whales again they must have come within a squall as there was many hanging about at dark the boats returned without success saw the reef of the top sails of the foremast stood to the Eastward through the night at daylight made sail latter part moderate cloudy weather saw Ocean Island bearing S.W. Lat by Obs. 10.24 South

Thursday March 8th 1849 Commences

with moderate breezes and cloudy weather by the wind with all sail set middle part equally with rain latter part very light air drifting down past the Island at 12 it bore N.W. dist 6 or 8 miles sound.

Friday March 9th 1849 Commences with

light air from the Eastward at half past one P.M. saw spouts to the N.W. a long distance off called them Whales sent the boats of in pursuit of them at 7 P.M. they returned on the out success did not see them on of the boat thick squally weather double reefed middle part wind from E.N.E. at daylight made sail latter part brisk trades from E.N.E. saw Breached Whales Lat by Obs. 8 miles S Long 167.50 East.

Ship Cambria from the Equator towards Guam

Saturday March 10th 1849 All there 24

hours brisk trades from the E.N.E. with fair weather steering South N.W. by N and N.W. repaired the rigging & sail & fore & topmast yards.

Lat by Obs. 9.47 North Long 167.46 East.

Sunday March 11th 1849 All there 24 hours

brisk trades from the E.N.E. with some showers of rain steering N.W. topmast standing sail set Lat by Obs. 4.32 N Long by Obs. 161.05 East

Monday March 12th 1849 All there

24 hours very strong trades from the Eastward with smoky weather first and middle part steering N.W. latter part steering N.W. by N employed sitting up Pipe Shocks took on the S.E. sails so as we could stand up and work Lat by Obs. 5.22 S Long by Obs. 163.59 East

Tuesday March 13th 1849 All there 24

hours brisk trades from the E.N.E. with smoky weather steering N.W. by N & N.W. all sail set employed sitting up Pipe Shocks sends Lat by Obs. 7.43 N Long by Obs. 171.13 E

Wednesday March 14th 1849 All there

24 hours fine trades with fair weather steering N.W. by N & N.W. all sail set latter part employed steering down the last 60000 ought to end. Lat by Obs. 8.56 North Long by Obs. 178.40 East

Thursday March 15th 1849 Commences

with brisk trades and fair weather steering N.W. all sail set employed clearing up fore & main decks middle part equally took on the light sails and set them again latter part very strong trades took on the light sails Cooper employed on his Shocks sends.

Lat by Obs. 11.23 N Long by Obs. 175.55 East

Friday March 16th 1849 All there 24 hours

very strong trades from N.E. with fair weather steering N.W. by N sends Lat by Obs. 11.45 N Long by Obs. 182.47 East

Saturday March 17th 1849 All there 24 hours

very strong trades from N.E. to S.W. steering N.W. part the time the light sails furled the fore & main sails sends Lat by Obs. 13.07 N Long by Obs. 189.48 East

Sunday March 18th 1849 All there 24 hours

fine trades and fair weather steering N.W. all sail set sends Lat by Obs. 13.46 Long by Obs. 197.25 East.
