

Ship Cambria from the Lachalin Sea towards the <sup>Islands</sup> Sandwiches

Thursday Sept<sup>r</sup> 5<sup>th</sup> 1849 Commences

with a fine breeze from the NW with pleasant weather steering S. by E. at 4 P.M. shifted fore top sail, at 8 the wind veered more to the North shifted over the standing sails middle part brisk wind latter part the wind backed to the E. N. E. and increased some took in the standing sails and Royals remove our cutting jacks and washed the smock off them so ends.

Lat by Obs<sup>n</sup> 43° 56' N Long by Obs<sup>n</sup> 152° 50' E.

Friday Sept<sup>r</sup> 6<sup>th</sup> 1849 Commences with

a brisk wind from E. N. E. and cloudy steering S. by E. at 9 P.M. the foot rope of the fore course parted split the sail took it in and all the light sails halftack so called all hands took in the fore main sail & put 2 reefs in the top sail's latter part wind from N. N. E. more moderate made sail on bent the fore sail & bent a new one so ends.

Saturday Sept<sup>r</sup> 7<sup>th</sup> 1849

Commences with brisk winds from the North inclined to moderate set the top mast & main & standing sails middle part wind at North steering S. by E. latter part steering S. by E. and E. by S. Land N. W. with fair weather so ends. Lat by Obs<sup>n</sup> 40° 03' Long by Obs<sup>n</sup> 148° 12' East.

Sunday Sept<sup>r</sup> 8<sup>th</sup> 1849 Commences with a

fine breeze from the NW with fair weather steering East on bent the Mizzen Sail and bent a new one middle part more moderate latter part wind from South to E. N. E. steering by the wind so ends. Lat by Obs<sup>n</sup> 39° 41' N Long by Obs<sup>n</sup> 138° 29' East.

Monday Sept<sup>r</sup> 9<sup>th</sup> 1849 All these 24 hours

moderate breeze from the E. N. E. with pleasant weather steering by the wind to the South so ends. Lat by Obs<sup>n</sup> 37° 58' Long by Obs<sup>n</sup> 137° 52' East.

Tuesday Sept<sup>r</sup> 10<sup>th</sup> 1849 Commences with

a light air from the E. N. E. with pleasant weather at 3 P.M. taken to the N. E. middle part nearly calm latter part a fine breeze from East to E. N. E. employed repairing the M. S. S. Carpenter enlarging our Potatoes house

Lat by Obs<sup>n</sup> 38° 19' North.

Wednesday Sept<sup>r</sup> 11<sup>th</sup> 1849 All these 24

hours a moderate breeze from E. by S. to E. N. E. with a bad head sea fine pleasant weather the watch variously employed carpenter at work on the house so ends.

Lat by Obs<sup>n</sup> 39° 40' N Long by Obs<sup>n</sup> 139° 42' East.

Thursday Sept<sup>r</sup> 13<sup>th</sup> 1849 All these 24 hours

light air from S. E. by S. with fine pleasant weather steering E. by S. when the ship would head to go ends. Lat by Obs<sup>n</sup> 40° 03' N Long by Obs<sup>n</sup> 150° 42' East.

Friday Sept<sup>r</sup> 14<sup>th</sup> 1849 Commences with

a light air from the NW with pleasant weather steering E. by S. middle part light air at West steering E. by S. latter part light air from South to N. E. steering full and by up E. by S. off E. N. E. some fog so ends Lat 39° 47' Long 152° 21' East.

Saturday Sept<sup>r</sup> 15<sup>th</sup> 1849 All these 24

hours faint air from N. E. to West with pleasant weather steering E. by S. when we could go ends. Lat by Obs<sup>n</sup> 39° 39' North.

Sunday Sept<sup>r</sup> 16<sup>th</sup> 1849 All these 24 hours

very faint air ship hardly has tenagage fine pleasant weather so ends. Lat by Obs<sup>n</sup> 39° 37' North Long by Obs<sup>n</sup> 153° 40' East.

Monday Sept<sup>r</sup> 17<sup>th</sup> 1849 Commences with all

a calm middle and latter part a moderate breeze from N. E. W. with showers of rain steering East so ends. Lat by Obs<sup>n</sup> 39° 15' Long 155° 17' East.

Tuesday Sept<sup>r</sup> 18<sup>th</sup> 1849 All these 24 hours

fine breeze from the NW with pleasant weather steering East with all sail set latter part employed bundling bone so ends.

Lat by Obs<sup>n</sup> 39° 26' Long by Obs<sup>n</sup> 157° 40'

Wednesday Sept<sup>r</sup> 19<sup>th</sup> 1849 Commences

with a moderate breeze from the N. E. W. with about weather steering East middle part fair weather after midnight the wind backed round to the North took in the standing sails and main Royal latter part took in winds from N. E. to E. N. E. took in the fore top & main & Mizzen S. S. sails so ends.

Lat by Obs<sup>n</sup> 38° 31' N Long by Obs<sup>n</sup> 150° 35'

Thursday Sept<sup>r</sup> 20<sup>th</sup> 1849 Commences with

a brisk wind from the E. N. E. with fair weather at 6 P.M. took in the main & S. S. sail put on reef in the fore & main top sail's middle part more moderate set the M. S. S. at daylight made all sail at 7 P.M. taken to the N. E. there part a moderate breeze from the E. by S. with a large head sea filled up the deck & butts so ends.

Lat by Obs<sup>n</sup> 37° 09' Long by Obs<sup>n</sup> 151° 45' East

Friday Sept<sup>r</sup> 21<sup>st</sup> 1849 Commences with a

moderate breeze from the Eastward and blew it middle part some rain at 2 P.M. the wind veered to S. E. kept the ship East at 6 P.M. the wind veered to N. W. set the main Royal top mast & S. S. standing sail's latter part pleasant steering E. by S. so ends. Lat by Obs<sup>n</sup> 37° 33'
