

Ship Cambria from the Arctic Ocean Towards the S. Isles
Monday August 26th Commences

with a moderate breeze from the N.E. with cloudy weather steering
E.S.E. at 4 P.M. spoke the Fore Top Gallant Sail and set it middle part light
air from N.E. with fog latter part light air and calm with
fog employed ~~boiling~~ so ends. No Observation

Tuesday August 27th Commences

with a moderate breeze from the N.E. with cloudy weather steering
E.S.E. at 4 P.M. spoke the Bark Spruce of New Bedford 31 months
out 300 Sp. in 1100 Whales at 5 P.M. spoke the Bark at the Main
Sail at 12 mid night the wind veered to the North latter part a
fine breeze from N.W. with some fog steering E.S.E. employed clearing
up between 6 docket so ends. Lat by Obs. 66° 19' North.

Wednesday August 28th Commences

with brisk wind from the N.W. and steering to the South foggy weather
about 5 P.M. made the East part of Normanoff's Isle set aboard of
at 6 passed between that and the small Island that lay 2 or 3 miles to the
S.E. of it middle part the wind veered on to the N.E. Sails put 2 reefs in
the top Sails at 5 P.M. took in the Main Sails fore & Mizzen top Sails commenced
Coopering the O'ib latter part employed steering O'ib at 11 set the
Fore Top Sail let the reef out of the Main & the Main & E. Sails so ends.
Lat by Obs. 64° 24' North.

Thursday August 29th Commences

with brisk wind from North steering South S.W. and S.W. at 5 P.M.
made St. Lawrence Id. bearing S.W. about 30 miles Dist. halled up to
pass to the North of it about 9 passed light off South middle part brisk gales
took in the E.S. Sails latter part more moderate all hands employed
bending our new Sails rigged our Lower, Top, Mast, Fore & Main top Gallant
Studding Sails fore & Main Topgals and set them so ends.
Lat by Obs. 62° 27' North.

Friday August 30th Commences with

a moderate breeze from the North steering S.W. with all drawing
Sail set at 4 P.M. took our Waist Boat in put her over heads
middle part moderate breeze from North to N.W. steering S.W.
latter part wind moderate from about North set another top part of Top Gallant
Studding Sail the Coopering employed repairing the Waist Boat
at 12 saw Good Island bearing S.E. by Comp. Lat by Obs. 61° 14' Long 173° 29'

Ship Cambria from the Arctic Ocean Towards the S. Isles 1850
Saturday August 31st Commences

with a light air from the North steering S.E. with Studding Sails both cables middle
and latter part a fine breeze from N.W. to N.N.W. with fine pleasant weather
steering S.E. by E. with all drawing Sail set so ends.

Lat by Obs. 59° 48' N Long by Obs. 172° 40'

Sunday September 1st Commences

with moderate breeze from the N.W. with pleasant weather steering S.E. by S
middle and latter part both winds from N.W. to N.N.W. with pleasant weather
steering S.E. by S with Studding Sails set to all sides so ends.

Lat by Obs. 57° 50'

Monday September 2nd All these 24 hours

fine breeze from North to N.W. steering S.E. by S
with all drawing Sail set so ends. Lat by Obs. 55° 48' N Long by Obs. 171° 37'

Tuesday September 3rd Commences with

a moderate breeze from the N.W. with cloudy weather steering S.E. by S
at 7 P.M. the wind halled round to the S.W. halled in the lower Studding
Sail and all the larboard Studding Sails middle part the wind halled a
little more to the South halled up sharp halled in all the Studding Sails
took in the Topgals at 8 P.M. spoke the Bark Rajah of New York
38 months out 1700 Whales 300 Sp. in Capt. West came on board and
spent the day so ends. Lat by Obs. 54° 33' Long by Obs. 170° 34'

Wednesday September 4th Commences with

brisk wind from the W. with cloudy weather steering by the wind
to the S.E. in company with the Rajah at 5 P.M. Capt. West went on
board of his Ship middle and latter part brisk wind from South to
S.W. with cloudy weather at 8 P.M. saw the land bearing
E.S.E. by Comp. 20 or 30 miles Dist. supposed it to be Ulmanak Id. but
saw more land to the S.W. about the same Dist. stood in to the S.E.
until 12 then lashed could not fetch the passage so ends.
Lat about 53° 05' North.

Thursday September 5th Commences with

a brisk wind from the South steering by the wind with all Sails set
at 1 P.M. went on board of the Rajah and stayed until 6 then came on board
and took in the Main Sail put 2 reefs in the Top Sails middle part brisk
wind from the South to E.S.E. with cloudy at 5 P.M. we came within an
ace of running into the Rajah but a misfire as good as a mile latter part the
wind increased to a gale shortened Sail so ends. No Observations.
