

Ship Cambria from the Arctic Ocean towards Sandwich Isles.
Friday Septm 6th Commences with brisk
gales from the ESE with thick weather close reef fore & main top sails at
Unmack Island in sight to the Eastward 10 or 15 miles off middle part
wind at East took in the fore top sail at 9 P.M. set it again at 3 A.M.
at 4 A.M. took it in again then 24 hours ends with brisk gales and
thick equally weather. No Observation.

Saturday Septm 7th Commences with
brisk gales and thick weather middle part more moderate set the
top sails latter part made all sail and stood in for the land with
thick weather could see the land by spells at 12 it bore East
by Cape Papah saw a bark off our lee judged the land to be
8 or 10 miles from us could see none of the Islands that is layed down
on the chart to the Westward of Unmack for that reason I think
they are not where they are layed down. No Observation.

Sunday Septm 8th Commences with
brisk winds from the Eastward with thick weather and spells of fog steering
by the wind to the S.E. at 7 P.M. shortened sail and wore thick middle
part thick weather kept the ship about here she was at dark or as
near as possible at 4 A.M. made all sail about 10 the fog lit up
found ourselves close in with the west part of Unmack Isle
at 11 the weather cleared away fine saw the passage between the
main Island and the small ones wind from E.S.E. just lay the course
to ends. Lat by Obs. 53.03 N Long by Obs. 169.28 West.

Monday Septm 9th Commences with a
fine breeze from the ESE with pleasant weather saw a great many
Hump Backs at 5 P.M. the South Point of Unmack Island bore E.S.E. by
compass 10 or 12 miles which places it in the Latitude according to my
calculations of 52.45 North and Long 169.28 West at 4 P.M. the wind began to blow
on by 11 it increased to a smart gale took in sail close reef fore & main
main top sails and shortened latter part the wind moderated made all sail
wind through the 24 hours from E.N.E. to E.S.E. to ends.

Lat by Obs. 51.38 N Long by Obs. 169.45 West.

Tuesday Septm 10th Commences with brisk
winds from the Eastward with thick rainy weather at 3 P.M. put a reef in the
top sails middle part more moderate at 4 A.M. the wind left us at 7 took a breeze from
S.W. kept the ship S.E. by E all the forenoon set the fore & main top sails at 10 the ship drove so
heavy in the head sea shortened sail. Lat by Obs. 50.40 Long 169.25 West.

Ship Cambria while on the Passage to the Sandwich Isles from the Arctic
Wednesday Septm 11th Commences with
brisk winds from S.W. with thick weather steering S.E. by E. employed
ed taking up the Sheath of the Southerly Tack through the night
there was a heavy rain to the South and finally died away calm at 4 A.M.
a breeze sprang up from the Eastward which halled gradually round to
the North with thick rainy weather steering S.E. and E.S.E. to ends.
No Observation.

Thursday Septm 12th Commences with
a moderate breeze from the Westward with thick weather steering
E.S.E. at 6 P.M. the wind left us with a heavy swell from the S.E.
closed down the top sails at 9 P.M. at 1 A.M. took a breeze from the Eastward
made sail latter part wind from N.E. to N.W. by, moderate with thick
rainy weather. No Observation.

Friday Septm 13th Commences with
a light air from the N.W. which left us at 6 A.M. with a heavy sea from the
S.E. took in all the top sails closed down the top sails middle part calm with
thick weather at 4 A.M. a breeze sprang up from the Eastward made
all sail latter part a fine breeze from the Eastward with a thick foggy
steering S.E. by E. to ends. No Observation.

Saturday Septm 14th Commences
with a brisk wind from the Eastward with thick rainy weather middle
part the wind increased to a gale took in all sail but close reef fore & main
top sails and shortened sail, wind halled round to the S.E. at 4 A.M. the
wind halled to S.E. were ship to the Eastward latter part more moderate
set the fore sail and shortened top sail ends with a thick foggy.
No Observation as usual.

Sunday Septm 15th All these 24 hours
moderate gales from the ESE with thick rainy weather standing to the
Eastward with double reef top sails covering fore & main to ends.

No Observation as usual.

Monday Septm 16th first and middle
half a gale from the East by East with thick rainy weather latter
part calm & a thick foggy to ends. No Obs. but little signs of overboard one

Tuesday Septm 17th All these 24 hours
light air from the W and calm with a plenty of rain & fog.

Lat 47.08 North.
