

Ship Cambria from the Sandwich

Monday Oct. 28th Commences with a moderate breeze from the ENE with fair weather a bad sea on middle part much the same about midday the wind freshened up strong latter part very strong trades from ENE with fair weather steering S by E employed sitting up the lower Rigging so ends.

Lat by Obsn 11.57 N Long 156.45

Tuesday Oct. 29th Commences with brisk trades with pleasant weather steering by the wind heading up S by E took in the main Sails middle part the wind increased considerably at 1 P.M. put 2 reefs in the top Sails latter part a little more moderate at one reef out of the top Sails the ship washed a little water in such weather employed pulling a new rope to the Fore Sparer so ends

Wednesday Oct. 30th All three 24 hours very strong trades from N E to ENE steering by the wind with a reef in the Fore top Sail one in the main and Mizen cloudy weather some fits of rain so ends.

Thursday Oct. 31st Commences with brisk trades with fair weather steering by the wind heading up S by E middle part more moderate towards the reef out at the top Sails & Ship 1/2 latter part squally wind from East to SE so ends

Friday Nov. 1st Commences with moderate breeze with cloudy weather heading up S by E off the M middle part wind more steady with pleasant weather heading up S by E latter part much the same so ends

Saturday Nov. 2nd Commences with a fine trade from the ENE with pleasant weather heading up S E the most part of the time middle part much the same latter part wind light and baffling with showers of rain so ends No Observations

Sunday Nov. 3rd Commences with light baffling winds with showers of rain middle part much the same at 4 P.M. had a heavy squall which lasted about 3 hours with plenty of rain took in the top Sails put 2 reefs in the top Sails at midnight made all Sail again so ends

Monday Nov. 4th Commences with moderate trades from the SE with cloudy weather steering by the wind with the bar low and tallies aboard and all Sail set middle and latter part fine pleasant weather heading about S by W the ship makes considerable water we expect some where in her upper works

Tuesday Nov. 5th All three 24 hours moderate trades from the SE with fine pleasant weather all Sail set by the wind to the best advantage heading up the most of the time S by W variously employed about the ship

Lat by Obsn 4.15 N Long by Alt 155.47

Wednesday Nov. 6th All three 24 hours moderate trades and fine pleasant weather all Sail set by the wind to the best advantage heading South and S by W so ends

Lat by Obsn 2.24 N Long by Alt 156.35 West

Thursday Nov. 7th All three 24 hours moderate trades with fine pleasant weather steering by the wind with all Sail set heading up South off the ship the ship heeled about 1500 strokes in 24 hours

Lat by Obsn 11.43 N Long by Alt 157.14

Friday Nov. 8th All three 24 hours moderate trades and fine pleasant weather steering by the wind with all Sail set heading up S by E the most part of the time so ends

Saturday Nov. 9th All three 24 hours moderate trades with fine pleasant weather steering by the wind with all Sail set heading up S by E off South so ends
