

Ship Cambria from Pernambuco towards New Bedford Mass.
Wednesday March 12th Commences
with a moderate breeze from the Eastward with pleasant weather
steering N by W middle part much the same latter part brisk
winds from South to S E steering N N W saw a thick steering
N by N weather some cloudy employed Painting Ship in side
so ends Lat by Obs 25.10 Long by Obs 65.10

Thursday March 13th Commences
with a brisk wind from the South with thick weather stopped
Painting at 2 the wind began to blow on took in the light sails
half past 3 called all hands put 2 reefs in the top sails
had much rain for about one hour & half, worked off
some of the Paint during the night the wind hauled round
to the North at 4 A.M. reefed Ship latter part brisk wind from N by E
with pleasant weather at 12 let the reef out of the Main top sail
so ends Lat by Obs 29.27 Long by Obs 64.40

Friday March 14th Commences with
a moderate breeze from North to NNE with pleasant weather let the reef
out of the top sail set the top gallant sail & top gaff
on from the N.W. middle and latter part light airs from the North
and calm with fine pleasant weather latter part employed Painting
some inside so ends Lat by Obs 29.56 Long by Obs 65.53

Saturday March 15th Commences
with a moderate breeze from the NNE with pleasant weather
steering by the wind to the N.W. middle part moderate breezes from
the N.E. steering N W by N at 4 A.M. set the fore & the driving sail
at 7 set the fore & main S.E. the driving sails at 8 the wind veered
to East set the lower the driving sail latter part moderate breezes
from East to S.E. finished Painting inside so ends
Lat by Obs 31.14 Long by Obs 67.35

Sunday March 16th 1851 Commences
with a fine breeze from the S.E. with pleasant weather steering N.W.
with all drawing sail set during the middle part the wind
veered to the South shifted the the driving sails over latter part
a brisk wind from the S.W. with smoky weather
saw a number of seals so ends
Lat by Obs 33.13 Long by Obs 68.25

Ship Cambria from Pernambuco towards New Bedford Mass.
Monday March 17th Commences with
a brisk wind from the S.W. with smoky weather steering N.W.
at 8 P.M. hauled in the main top mast the driving sail at 4 P.M. hauled
in the S.E. the driving sails at 5 the main top gallant mast broke
off in the shroud hole cleared away the wreck and sent it down
on deck left the stump of the mast up there middle part more
moderate thick weather at 7 A.M. sent down the stump of
the main & gallant mast set the Carpenter at work and cut
a nother shroud hole left just head enough for the back stays &
fore & aft stay which made the mast about 2 feet shorter
than it was before sent the mast up set up the rigging
thick weather with some rain so ends No observation
(2 days)

Tuesday March 18th Commences with
brisk winds and raining with thunder & lightning in the Western
put 2 reefs in the top sail took in the jib at 1 P.M. took a bit
of a squall with much rain closed up every thing the squall
lasted but a few minutes then all calm about 2 P.M. took a brisk
wind from S.W. kept the ship N.W. set double reef top sails
and courses at 4 P.M. aloft reefed the top sail took in the
Main sail and jib during the night the wind increased some
and hauled to the ship took in the fore sail at 6 P.M. the fore topmast
stay sail blowed to pieces took in the Mizzen top sail and forenoon
at 10 A.M. kept off North ends with a brisk gale from N.W. and
specially judged our place in the Gulf Stream No observation

Wednesday March 19th Commences
with a brisk gale from the N.W. with squally weather at 6 P.M.
reefed the fore sail set it and the Mizzen top sail middle part
moderate set the jib & the main sail let one reef out of the top sails
at 7 let another out of the main top sail set the main S.E. sail
brisk wind from the N.W. and squally weather so ends
Lat by Obs 35.35 Long by N 38.35

Thursday March 20th Commences
with a brisk wind from the N.W. with thick weather steering by the
wind to the North with a reef in the top sails middle part more
moderate let the reef out latter part set the S.E. & D. brisk winds from
W.N.W. to N.W. saw a number of seals Lat by Obs 40.15 Long 68.58
