

Ship Cambria from Pernambuco Towards New Bedford 1851
 Friday March 21st Commences with
 a brisk wind from the NW with squalls of Snow standing to the North
 passed 3 Barks on the opposite tack saw one on the same tack with us
 at 3 took in the Fore & Mizzen & Haul at 5 P.M. tacked to the SW
 took in the Main & put a reef in the Fore & Mizzen top sails middle
 part bristled wind from NW with a bad head sea latter part the
 same saw a number of seals the ship makes about the water
 she has done 7 or 800 strokes per hour

 Saturday March 22nd Commences with
 a brisk wind from the N by E with cloudy weather steering by the
 wind with the starboard tack alone 2 reefs in the Fore & Haul one
 in the Main & Mizzen 2 ships in sight at 6 P.M. tacked to the NW
 at 7 let one reef out of the Fore top sail middle part more moderate
 set the 3d sail & Mizzen at 8 P.M. tacked to the NW and latter part
 a fine breeze from NW to NW with fine pleasant weather saw one
 ship standing to the starboard and 2 small craft standing by to back & forward

Sunday March 23rd Commences with
 a moderate breeze from the NW with pleasant weather steering by the wind to the
 starboard at 3 P.M. the wind left us at 5 rounded up 52 fathoms green sand
 middle part calm remained so until 10 P.M. then took a breeze from NW
 sent up the Fore & Mizzen & Royal yards set all the standing sails a number
 of seals in sight to windward Lat by Chron 40° 52' N Long by Chron 50° 15'

Monday March 24th Commences with
 a moderate breeze from the Eastward which increased by 5 P.M. to a
 gale took in every reef & let 3 reefs out of top sails middle part
 bristled gales from NW at 2 P.M. the wind began to moderate set in a
 thick fog at 4 the wind left us at 5 P.M. took a breeze from the
 North which foggy surrounded a number of times in about 25 fathoms
 found sand & shells one cast at a nother found Brown sand
 at a nother dark green sand about half past 11 the fog let up
 middle sail found Lat by Chron 41° 54' N North

 Tuesday March 25th Commences with
 a brisk wind from the NW with fine weather at 1 P.M. tacked to the North
 wind veered to N by E about 2 made Gay Head bearing N by N
 got our Chances bent & anchored off the town about
 sunset took a pilot just inside the Light boat half
 past 9 P.M. came too off Blasted Point fueled the
 ship so ends the voyage in the Cambria
 54 months and 12 days.
