Overcast splendid smooth sea and almost continuous drizzling pronounced tidal current to mag line ship in the proximity of Princess Alice Bank all through chronometer puts us 15 miles off the S.E. coast of Fayal
38-14 N.

Sept 16

Fair and light easterly wind raise whale lower boat and get it fluked by 12 noon cut in body and separate the head & tail fins 38-16 N.
Chro. out land not in sight 21-47 N.

Sept 17

Fair and very light E. winds cut in head and stow away cutting gear ship under bare poles set main trysail at night
38-16 N.

Sept 18

Boiling whale fine weather
27-10 N. by Chro.
29-00 N.

Sept 19

Finish Boiling light E. winds ship under full sail and by the wind
27-19 N. by Chro.
38-31

Fair and calm ship under all sails sight Fayal and find true Chro. 14 miles off
26-34 N.
