Fair fresh winds and choppy sea.
all sail and steering S. by W.
Onward by noon and all during
afternoon.

Oct. 19

S.E. winds fresh and choppy sea
ship under all sail and steering
S.
26-49 N.
25-00 W.

Oct. 20

Fair moderate S.E. winds ship under
full sail and steering S. by W.
22-28 N.
26-49 W.

Oct. 21

Fair and moderate winds all sail
and steering S. then S. by E.
21-17 N.
26-21 W.

Oct. 22

Fair and moderate good winds
under all sail and steering S. by
the wind S. by E. in sight 25-07 N. 17-35 W.

Oct. 23

Fair and moderate winds ship
close into St Vincent bay in
early morning sail in and come
to the anchor at 8 A.M. find
Bry. Sullivan in harbour.

Oct. 24

Get ready and leave St Vincent harbour
by 7 P.M. with moderate N.E. trade
off the point and shape course.

Oct. 25

Very light trades and well to
the north under all sail and
steering S. by W. 25-14 N. 15-30 W.

Oct. 26

Light trades steering S. under all sail.
Hisson on board 9 stowage namely
Rabato Almeida, Raphael Soares,
Marco Ramos, Joseph Peters Pedro
Marcellino, Theophilo Almeida,
Joaquim Lopes, Antonio Huarte,
Francisco Lertorio, which I have
properly entered on account book
Oct. 26 1912 - Seaman Francisco Dias
deserted ship at S.V. Oct. 24-12
25-07 N. 18-33 W.

Oct. 27

Light winds well to the N. steering S. under
all sail
Lat 11-41 N.

Oct. 28

Fair and moderate winds well to N
steering S. by E. under full sail.
Lat 10-15 N.

Oct. 29

Light winds from S.E. with occasional
squalls under about 7 sail in morning
steering by the wind all sail again in
afternoon Lat 8-12 N. 22-47 W.

Oct. 30

Light southerly winds with squalls
ship under all sail and by the wind
heading S. S.W. & S.W. by S. 7-16 N. 23-08 W.
