Overcast, rain, and fresh N.E. winds in early morning later calm and a ground swell at 11-A.M. light southerly winds and overcast set try'sails and jib on for starboard tack heading E. a poor dinner set fare's and steers E.N.E. with light S.E. wind cleared up fine and sea smoothed down considerable take in fare's late and set fore try'sails on eastern tack for night

Dec. 30

Fair and light winds from S.W. ship under full sail running N.N.W. and N.W. take in sail at night and lay on starboard tack

50-14 N. 34-07 S.

Dec. 31

This day partly clear and strong S.E. to E.S.W. winds ship under try'sails all day and laying on E. tack

49-51 N. 33-39 S.

Jan. 1. 1913

Partly overcast fresh S.E. winds squally cleared up fine during day wind lighter and a smoother sea ship all day on east sail and on E. tack set try'sails and lay on port tack for the night

48-48 N. 34-36 S.

Jan. 2

All day calm no headway lower boats far what we thought was whale turn out to be grass pines under bare poles

34-22 S.

Jan. 3

Fair and light to fresh N. winds ship under short sail until 7 A.M. and on starboard tack then were ship's and set main'sail on port tack staying by the wind. See amount of Grampus at 4 P.M. raise school to see what it is. Townes with 280 bbl of oil had seen Woodruff with whale along side that would make him 200 had seen G. Bell. the last of Dec with 250 bbl. also reported. Talker off a brook with 160 bbl. Chronometer agrees with J. Townes. that had been rated by passing Steamer Jan. 2-13 Day with fare's on port tack.

49-07 N. 34-15 S.

Jan. 4

This day fair and fresh to moderate N. winds ship under short sail and on port tack till 7 P.M. then on starboard. See J.T. at night take in fare's and jib set fore try'sails

Jan. 5

This day strong N.W. winds ship under short sail and on port tack heading N.W. in afternoon keep off S. at night lay on starboard tack under try'sails
