small white water off west the beam

Jan. 25

A. Knowles
Woodbury

This day commenced with moderate S. winds
and a shower set fair in early
morning and sail on starboard
tack till 7-30 A.M. then we ship
take in fair at night. Woodbury
and A. Knowles in sight

35-00 S.

Jan. 26

Fair and light air from E. with a
ground swell ship under short sail
and on S. tack. Woodbury in sight
run S. in night with fair

35-13 S. 51-12 E.

Jan. 27

This day commenced with a moderate
breeze from the N. were ship at 6 AM.
and steer S.S.W. Sail for an hour
due E. saw white water turn out to be
grampus. Overcast in afternoon with
increasing winds veering to the S.W.

36-05 S.

Jan. 28

Log has
started in morning

Light S.W. gales laying to under
short sail and on S. tack

50-04 N. 37-12 S.

Jan. 29

Fair and fresh N. winds decreasing
gradually at night nearly calm

Whale

See whales in late afternoon lower boats
and get 4 fluked by midnight

"about" 36-45 S. 50-05 E.

Jan. 30

Fair and calm cut in whales in
morning and light fires at noon
had little wind from N. put ship
on E. tack wind veered to N. and
increased to a fresh breeze by night

49-49 N. 36-30 S.

Jan. 31

Fair and S. gales gradually decreasing
after noon bailing under short sail
and laying on port tack

50-41 N. 36-18 S.

Feb. 1

Whale

This day fair and calm in morning then
light N.W. winds raise whale fat 145
P.M. and have her fluked by 5-30
Set up cutting gear and lay the
night with whale alongside

36-28 S. 50-50 E.

Feb. 2

Log has
started in morning

Fair and strong winds from N.W. and
a choppy sea could do nothing with
head troll in whale's body and
let go head in afternoon wind
moderated light fires and
commence bailing at noon

Feb. 3

Whale

Fair and light N.W. to N.E. winds
raise whales at 10 A.M. lower boats
get a 70 lb. whale fluked by 12 noon
cut in and done by 8 P.M. 37-23 S.
