Moderate winds E.S.E. occasional squall ship on starboard tack by the wind heading E. by N. Late in afternoon wind veering to E.

30-16 V. 37-40 N.

Sept. 9th

Moderate S winds choppy seas ship under full sail and by the wind on the S tack westward at 2-30 P.M. and full and by on Southern tack

29-02 V. 38-59 N.

Sept 10

Fresh S.E. winds ship under full sail light land afternoon hawking E. go on S tack wind haul to the E.

38-28 N.

Sept 11

To S. of Fayal beat up all day got close to land.

Sept. 12

To the St. Fayal light S.E. wind beat up and drop anchor in the harbor after dinner moving ship

Sept 13

In Fayal harbor doing various light jobs

Sept 14

At anchor and off duty

Sept. 15. 16. 17. 18

At anchor and doing small jobs.

Sept. 19. & 20

Discharging oil and cooping cask.

Sept. 21-22-23-24-25-26-27-28-29 and 30th in

Fayal harbor discharging latrine in provision water etc.
