

Jan. 16 Moderate to fresh easterly gale and swell -
 was rain ship under short sail and
 laying on starboard tack at night put
 out fires on account of smoke sail
 giving away reef fore and fore
 stay'd. Blive heavy during night
 with a very low barometer at 2.30 of the
 morning of the 17th wind gave out suddenly
 after squall. Boiling like a good one.
 Overcast all day.

Jan. 17

This day clear, overcast rainy and foggy
 consecutively. Light E winds with a ground
 swell. Sch. trying to be read another
 still more to be read with both down at about
 11. Ship under try sail and jib kept off and
 by time we got close raised a sch. whale
 floured boat at 2 P.M. got 6 lost one
 and had 5 plucked at 7 P.M. Jan. 18 Out all
 night towing whales no observations

This day fair until noon then rain until late
 afternoon. Weather wind light with a ground swell
 shore whales plucked by 7 am. put up gear
 after break fast and cut in two whales till
 noon gave up on account of rain at 5
 P.M. took on to another lea 2 alongside
 sch. in sight and cutting by all appearances

This day moderate to fresh westerly gale high
 swell cut in 2 whales in morning the last
 one with difficulty light fires at noon
 Sch. "2" met in sight and cutting and later boiling
 Bar 12 here in sight late in the day ship on
 port tack and under main try sail and fore stay'd
 set fore sail in the night

Jan. 20

This day commenced with a fresh S.W. wind a high
 swell ship under full sail and maintained and fir
 on port tack 13k. in sight in early morning
 and boiling wind decreasing gradually
 until at 8 P.M. it was calm were ship
 at 4 P.M. and put her to the east
 51-28.4 24-26 S.

This day overcast and light variable winds
 ship under short sail and running S.E. rain
 and heavy no chance to make observations
 lay on starboard tack for night finish boiling.
 A.E. Whyland in sight and boiling.

Fair with E. wind light set all sail in morning
 and leave Sch. off weather quiet at 6 P.M.
 See Sch. with boats down tack ship
 and get close at 7.30 lower boats as sch.
 boats got just to a pull at about 10.30
 but boats got the 2nd 500th bull hump
 whale plucked by 12 noon dinner cutting
 gear and cut the whale

This day clear and fine light E. winds
 ship under full sail and by the wind on
 port tack heading S.E. See carcass
 A.E. Whyland in sight shorten sail at
 night and lay on same tack
 50.36 N. 35.15 S.

Jan. 24

Partly overcast and a light to moderate N.E.
 wind ship under short sail and running S.E.
 had to huff to along in afternoon on account of swell
 lay the night on port tack with fore and jib and
 main try sail
