

June 26 This day partly overcast and rain ship under short sail and on port and then starboard tack

June 27 This day fair and light S.W. winds at 6 am set all sail had to take in main's and light sails on account of fresh winds and squalls in afternoon on
34-51 ft. 54-58 ft.

June 28 This day rain and overcast in early morning then clear with a light wind in afternoon all sail and steering S. and S. Shorten sail at night saw dead whale one lanced on the 22nd mt.
35-39 ft.

June 29 This day fair with light S.W. winds ship under full sail and on the S.E. tack by the wind raised dead whale in morning see purple and 2 logs got some fish shorten sail at night
35-16 ft. 35-54 ft.

June 30 This day fair and light southerly winds ship under full sail on E. tack raised purple and fish speak merchant Norwegian compare longitude "good" shorten down to fore stay's and fore main rig's
54-27 ft. 35-30

Compare ship with Norwegian

July 1st This day fair with fresh southerly winds ship under main's and flying jib clearing S.E. in morning and then S.E. Saw merchant ship purple etc. rolls of seaweed shorten down to fore stay's fore's and fore's and lay the night on starboard tack
53-28 ft. 35-50 ft.

July 2nd This day partly overcast with a strong ship all day under short sail and on S. and S.W. wind. S.E. tack took in flying jib at night
35-42 ft.

July 3 This day clear and fine fresh S.W. winds ship under full sail since early morning raised whale at noon and later after dinner smelt school of small whales going fast to windward could do nothing shorten down on port tack for night
57-05 ft. 34-48 ft.

July 4th This day fair and light S.W. winds ship under full sail and on E. tack raised whale at noon and chase until we were run of whale

July 5th Very light winds from S.W. see large whale going fast to windward chase until late afternoon when whale was out of sight at night nearly calm.
