

July 6th This day fine and calm in morning with a light air from S.W. in afternoon set all sail on Westward tack shorten down at night and lay on same tack with position and find ship to the S. of last where whales have been seen last 3 days

July 7th This day calm with a light air from the N. in afternoon set all sail and take it all in at night. From five

50-17 ft. 31-32 ft.

July 8th This day Fair with a light S.W. wind ship under full sail and on the weather tack shorten sail at night and lay under fore and main trysail and flying jib on port tack S.W. gale

50-25 ft. 31-35 ft.

July 9th This day fair and very light S.W. wind ship under all sail and on starboard tack see school of small whales got two after chasing some time before them fast along side in the morning

34-46 ft.

July 10th Fair and fine nearly calm cut in whales and make sail shorten down at night backing

33-55

July 11th This day fine and calm raise whales daylight then comes a light air breeze at 9 AM. Whales have one bull fast alongside at 4 AM. third mate got fast to another and fast line cut head and roll body

July 12th This day fair and a light S.W. wind cut in head and sail on starboard tack under short sail all day lay on same tack at night

33-40 ft. 42-56 ft.

July 13th Fair and light winds ship under all sail and on both tacks alternately shortened down at night

July 14th This day fresh S.W. wind with overcast weather and a choppy sea all sail in morning then take in jib top of fore and forenoon at distance she run to us a distance and then stopped

July 15th Overcast and rain in morning with clear weather strong S.W. wind and high seas ship on N. tack all day short sail.

July 16th This day overcast and rain calm in early morning and then a light to fresh S.W. wind raise school of whales and got one cut in late in afternoon see four whale a distance to windward too late to lower
