

Sept. 3 This day fair and moderate N.E. wind under full sail at night spar tendor down all day on Eastern Tack by the wind

Sept. 4 This day clear and with a very light N.E. wind first thing in morning and then calm until late afternoon when we set sail again and run off to leeward for white water "nothing doing."

36-40 N. 34-38 N.

Sept. 5 Very light winds occasional squall partly overcast ship under short sail and on S.E. Tack for a time and then on the other tack by the wind

34-39 N.

Sept. 6 Overcast and rain in morning with fresh winds and a high swell run off N.E. had to stop as the wind slackened in afternoon

Sept. 7 This day clear and fine light Easterly air set all sail and put her on N. Tack all day going very slow raised whales at 2 P.M. howls and give chase got fast to small cow line parted compass Chronometers with French paper time found Chas. put to us 28 miles to the N.

Sept. 8 This day light easterly air of to an all night calm set all sail and on N.E. Tack until noon and S.E. till night calm again at night lay under bare poles

Sept. 9 Calm in morning and then a light air from the E. set all sail and stay all day on N. Tack by the wind very smooth and clear

34-54 N.

Sept. 10 This day light easterly winds ship under full sail and by the wind on starboard tack heading 12 by compass.

35-56 N. 34-23 N.

Sept. 11 This day clear and fine with a light Easterly wind ship under full sail and on port tack heading E.

37-10 N. 32-43 N.

Sept. 12 This day clear and fine with light E winds on port tack full and by heading E. by N. all sail set. *off 10:23*

38-23 N. 30-37 N.

Sept. 13 Easterly winds light raised whales and chase until 1:30 P.M. first boat and lowered again at 4 P.M. without better result

Sept. 14 Fair and small day calm laying under bare poles overcast at noon so that it was impossible to take an altitude at night a little wind but not enough to make sail van account of ground swell.
