

April 3rd

This day fair and with a fresh trade ship under short sail and by the wind on port tack until 7 a.m. and then keep off N.W. set fire to the ship at night luff on port tack.

45-45 N. 13-48 E.

April 4 This day fair and with a fresh trade ship under short sail and running N.W. luff at night.

14-36 N.

April 5 Fair and with a moderate wind ship under short sail and running before the wind and heading N.W.

48-50 N. 15-54 E.

April 6 Fair moderate trades an occasional squall ship under short sail and running N.W.

16-25 N.

April 7 Fair and with a moderate wind from S.E. set all sail in early morning and run N.W. until midnight then stop in main of and get the ship and run S.W. under short sail.

52-17 N. 16-20 E.

April 8 This day fair and with fresh trades ship under full sail and steering course wind moderated during afternoon at night it was light.

53-46 N. 14-20 E.

April 9 This day commenced with moderate winds saw 3 masted ships looked like "Hoodruff" at 4-20 P.M. ship's course N.W. and S. by E. or E. at 6-30 P.M. making a N.W. and S. course.

55-07 N. 12-48 E.

April 10

This day commenced with a light to moderate trade luff in night at 9 a.m. ship under full sail and steering a N.W. and S. course at 7 P.M. luff S.W. hauled forward ahead at 10-30 P.M. and had to luff until morning to proceed with repairs day ended with a fresh gale.

56-51 N.

April 11

This day commenced with a fresh gale that abated a great deal towards afternoon set all sail at 5-30 P.M. the day ended with moderate gale. Repaired sprouts and keep off and steer course.

58-00 N. 13-54 E. Fair in morning 57-23 N. 13-40 E.

April 12

This day commenced with very fresh winds ship under full sail and steering course at 4 P.M. saw land and came to an anchor at 11 P.M. at the Harbour of Dartmouth, Anomima the day ended with any amount of rain. Long at 4 P.M.

61-03-20 N.

April 13

From April 13th to May 11th at anchor heaving out cables from ground. What had been in the ship ever since ship left home copper them and stow back pump oil from tanks into casks take in provisions, wood and water, varnish on rigging paint ship in and out and leave at 5-30 P.M. May 11th Discharged 2nd mate Joaquim Santos and ship Antonio Turres that heaves. Good sailing winds ship under full sail and bound to St. Pustatus.

May 12

This day fair and with a strong trade wind ship under full sail and approaching St. Pustatus dropped anchor in the harbour at 4-30 P.M. and stay in port until the 18th took in provisions ship Samuel Gilbert and and 3 men according to app. end to shipmen papers.

May 18th

Left harbour at 2-30 P.M. light winds and steer far.
