

June 3rd

Overcast all day in observation possible ship under full sail but top's ab and on N.W. tack with a S.W. wind until 4 P.M. when we took in main'sail and set main try'sail on S. Tack.

June 4th

Overcast with rain and fog in afternoon, raised whales in early morning set main'sail and kept off S.W. with a S.E. wind very light and a ground swell lower boats at 7 A.M. and going chase until 3-30 P.M. with no success Large sch 31-50 ft.

June 5th

Overcast in morning and clear in afternoon light S. to S.E. wind ship under full sail and by the wind on one tack until 10 P.M. and the other still night shorten sail and were ship.

53-02 ft. 32-02 ft.

June 6th

Fair and moderate to light S.E. wind with a ground swell very heavy ship under full sail and on S. tack since morning sail all night and on S. tack 30-10 ft.

June 7th

Fair with occasional squall ship under full sail until 2 P.M. took in main'sail for repairs all day on S. Tack heading E. and S.W. with a S.E. wind

51-37 ft. 33-09 ft.

June 8th

Fair with S.E. winds under full sail raised sch. of bulls at noon and lower boats got fast to one line parted shorten down at night

49-52 ft. 33-39 ft.

June 9th

Fair and with overcast spells and squalls ship under full sail and first on one tack and then the other saw steamer and a horse boat shorten down at night 33-38 ft.

June 10th

This day fair and with a light S. wind ship under full sail and on the S. & back raised sch. bulls lower boats but could not get fast. calm late in afternoon took in all sail

June 11th

Overcast with a heavy atmosphere ship under full sail and by the wind on one tack and then the other winds very light and from the S.

June 12th

Fair and very clear and smooth ship under full sail and by the wind on S tack with a S.E. wind in morning and on S.W. tack with a S. wind in afternoon shorten sail at night

53-24 ft. 33-00 ft.

June 13

Most beautiful day ship under full sail and starting S.E. at night Cluff S.W. and kept sail another wind light and from S.W.

52-54 ft. 32-24 ft.

June 14th

Fresh N.W. wind ship under full sail and beating to leeward until 4-30 P.M. when we raised sch. whales going fast to windward saw back to leeward took to be "Wanderer" no chance to lower boats back to leeward had chased same whale

52-23 ft. 31-00 ft.

June 15th

Choppy and with fresh winds from S.W. ship under full sail and on both tack consecutively saw Sch. Valkyrie clear

51-45 ft. 31-18 ft.

June 16th

Strong winds from N.W. gradually veering to the N. and E. ship under short sail and on S. tack all day

31-45 ft.
