

July 3<sup>rd</sup> Fair and smooth light N. winds ship under full sail  
 "Margaret" by the wind on N. N. tack shorter down at night  
 "Speak" "Margaret" 51-22 N. 33-00 N.

July 4<sup>th</sup> Fair and smooth ship under short sail until 7.30 am  
 " " set all sail and put her on N. N. tack heading N. by  
 " " compare "Speak" "Margaret" 51-45 N. 33-13 N.

July 5<sup>th</sup> Fair and smooth light winds lower parts  
 at noon far school and have 7 fished by night.  
 51-54 N. 33-35 N.

July 6<sup>th</sup> Light wind fog cutting down by noon set fire  
 " " saw Alice & her crew but do not speak her  
 33-16

July 7<sup>th</sup> Fair and smooth ship under full sail and  
 heading to windward N. N. in sight came among  
 " " school  
 51-04 N. 33-18 N.

July 8<sup>th</sup> Fair and with N. N. winds ship under full sail  
 " " and by the wind saw school boats and lower  
 " " boats after break fast got 3 and cut one in  
 in afternoon leave two along side bailing  
 Alice & went out of sight in morning  
 33-21 N.

July 9<sup>th</sup> Fair and light N. winds ship at tack and  
 cutting and bailing were ship and tack  
 in main at 5 P.M.  
 50-48 N. 33-02 N.

July 10<sup>th</sup> Fair light N winds full sail and by the wind one  
 tack and the other cruising bailing school  
 248-396-356-238-376-376-352

July 11<sup>th</sup> Wind from E. fresh in morning and light in afternoon  
 clear and fine make full sail in morning and  
 beat to wind all day  
 50-50 N. 33-20 N.

July 12<sup>th</sup> Light wind ship under full sail and run all  
 " " day to the N and N. saw Margaret with 250  
 " " departed Vista July 8<sup>th</sup> 500 shorter down at  
 " " night  
 51-14 N. 33-21 N.

July 13<sup>th</sup> Moderate good wind beating to wind all day  
 Margaret chasing what to do our weather beam  
 did not get it lay under short sail and an  
 different tack for night.  
 51-21 N. 23-20 N.

July 14<sup>th</sup> Fair with moderate good wind from S. N. ship under  
 full sail and steering N. N. N. At night luff and  
 lay on starboard tack under full main trysail and  
 luff  
 51-05 N. 33-32

July 15<sup>th</sup> This day commenced with heavy rains a fresh  
 southwesterly wind and choppy sea cleared some in  
 early hours of morning ship under short sail and  
 on starboard tack heading S. E. at 7.30 were ship  
 and run to the N. N. under short sail at 9 am set all  
 sail and steer N. N. N. Fair weather schooner was  
 sighted she was close hauled on S. E. tack. At 11 am 33.44  
 shorter down at night and luff on S. E. tack.  
 52-05 N. 33-44 N.

July 16<sup>th</sup> This day commenced with a fresh N. N. wind partly  
 overcast and with a choppy sea set all sail in  
 morning and steer by the wind on N. N. tack at  
 7.30 Am. tack ship took in main at noon on  
 account of rainy and squally weather lay on S. E. tack
