

July 17 This day commenced with heavy rain squalls light S.W. winds and partly overcast ship under short sail and on S. to off were ship at 7-30 and set all sail then S.W. Took in main sail at 4-30 P.M. on account of swell and very light winds

51-39 S. 33-18 N.

July 18th

Fair and with very light winds in early morning and from S.W. increasing gradually fine and clear gam A.L. See Knowles with 550 Reported B.D. N. band N. 350 S. strikes 200 boarded Lab. General Laurie from Halifax to Pomeroy got new papers

50-57 S. 21-34 N.

July 19th

This day commenced with a light S.W. wind clear and fine set all sail and run S.W. until noon Alice Knowles ahead and close aboard at noon 2-30 P.M. off some more at night shorten down and take on W. tack

33-55 S.

July 20th

Fair and smooth ship under full sail and by the wind until 7-30 P.M. and then A.K. reefed off S.W. A.L. goes out of sight on the tack wind S.W. and veering to E. Fresh in morning and lighter in afternoon shorten down at night and stay on one tack till midnight and on the other till morning

33-28 N.

July 21st

Fair and with a moderate S.W. to S. wind saw whales or what looked like whales spouting a good way to windward just one rising

beat on that direction all day and see no more of it at night Alice H. close on board and the capt came aboard shorter sail at night.

52-33 S. 33-26 N.

July 22nd

This day fair and with a fresh to moderate S.W. winds ship under full sail and by the wind kept off S. and in afternoon five over and star N. a 3 masted schooner bore in sight at 5-P.M. buff and shorter sail at night.

July 23

This day fair and with a moderate to light winds from S. and E. ship under full sail and steering off S. and N. saw sch. Chasing whalers two boats in afternoon and hit them shortly after B.D. Jackson with 480 lbs of oil at night gained Dead End with 150 lbs buff and shorter down at night.

54-00 S. 21-22 N.

July 24

This day fair and with a light wind from the southward ship under full sail and cruising Dead End Jackson in sight. a bark bore in sight in afternoon 90 S.W. to N. and E. shorten down at night.

July 25th

Fair and with very light winds ship under full sail bark "Andrew Hicks" close aboard gam him all day had 650 lbs oil at night wind nearly dead lay under short sail.
