

July 26th This day commenced with a light E. wind overcast and an abundance of rain after daylight rain let up ship under short sail (sails) steering N.E. raised whale at 9 am. and hauled fluked by 1 P.M. put up gear and out in whale line head out side

July 27 This day clear and fine out in head and start fires ship under short sail and on N. tack
 Star 362-339-346-357-356 33-27

July 28th Good moderate westerly winds raised whales at 10 am and run N.E. under full sail raised them again at 2 P.M. lower boats at 2-30 and hauled large whale fluked by 6 P.M.
 33-45 N. 55-36 N.

July 29 This day partly overcast with occasional squalls ship under short sail and hauled out in whale and start fires
 Lat. 33-45 N.

July 30th This day overcast very light winds from N. and a bit of a ground swell boiling under short sail and starting oil

July 31st This day commenced with fresh winds increasing to moderate gale near sunrise finished boiling at 7.30 am. wind moderated some in afternoon day ended with light winds
 34-07

August 1st This day fair and light winds ship under full sail and starting N.E. raised whales lower boats at 1.40 P.M. got a small cut in both and set boat whistles for night. Flat calm
 33-54 N. 55-19 N.

Aug 2nd All day calm raised sea whale and lower 3 boats and latter the 4th boat got a fluked cut in whale in late afternoon and start fires day ended with just a bit of air.
 33-44 N.

Aug 3rd This day fine in morning and with a couple of squalls latter raised whale in early morning and lower boats got one out of scum. Bulls fluked up and leave along side until morning blowing down oil.

Aug 4th This day fair in morning and overcast in afternoon with a lot of rain and increasing winds changing from E. to N.E. and then N.E. cut in whale in morning and lay under short sail in afternoon no operations possible
 Hauled 3 boats by fire and by water 1200 lbs of oil

Aug 5th This day light N.E. to N. winds a ground swell ship all day under short sail and on N. V. tack finish boiling star down some oil and clean ship lay for night on starboard tack nearly calm
 54-54 N. 33-58 N.

Aug 6th Flat calm to-day ship under bare poles ground swell sea grassy pen.
