

Remarks on board Scho: Camero master L. Lopez.

Fri. May 6th 1921

This day steady breeze & hazy weather. All sails set. At 2:52 p.m. Mate saw a white whale. At 4:30 Mate saw a whale drop the boat. Came Squall. See it again. Came a board. End of day. no observation.

Sat. May 7th 1921

This day Squall with rain all day. Wind from S. Ship laying on small sails. Saw nothing. pumps carefully attended. End of day. no observation.

Sun.

May 8th 1921

This day fresh breeze & hazy weather. Wind from SW ship running to Eastward on small sails. Saw nothing. Watch employed in ship duty. End of day. (Lat: 31° 03' N. Lon: 58° 48' W.)

Mon.

May 9th 1921

This day fresh breeze & clear weather. Wind from SW. all sails set. Running to Eastward. Day pumps got out at 6:30 p.m. Short in sails let lay. End of day. (Lat: 31° 11' N. Lon: 57° 48' W.)

Tues.

May 10th 1921

This day steady breeze & clear weather. Wind from SW. all sails set. Ship running to Eastward. At 6:30 short her down. Saw a steamer beyond. Watch employed in ship duty. End of day. (Lat: 31° 01' N. Lon: 56° 58' W.)

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Wed May 11th 1921

This day light breeze from SW. all sails set. At 5:55 a.m. Jose Surges saw school of whales drop the boat. Mate went along side of one struck iron came out. Came board. Saw steamer the same time bound W. End of day. (Lat: 31° 06' N. Lon: 56° 30' W.)

Thurs.

May 12th 1921

This day calm all day. At 5:35 a.m. Jose Surges saw a lone whale drop the boat. Third Mate got him. Came board got ready cutting the whale & sent gears down. End of day. (Lat: 30° 56' N. Lon: 56° 05' W.)

Fri.

May 13th 1921

This day light breeze & fine clear weather. Wind from NE all sails set. Saw nothing but fumes. Employed by night. Loris Rodriguez had some trouble with footstall last night. He is very troublesome this is four times he make a trouble board ship. End of day. (Lat: 30° 48' N. Lon: 55° 58' W.)

Sat.

May 14th 1921

This day strong breeze & clear weather. Wind from NE ship laying on small sails. Saw nothing. pumps carefully attended. End of day. (Lat: 30° 58' N. Lon: 56° 20' W.)

Sun.

May 15th 1921

This day strong breeze & high sea. Wind from NE ship on small sails. Saw nothing. pumps carefully attended. End of day. (Lat: 30° 56' N. Lon: 56° 06' W.)
