Mon: May 16th 1921
This day strong breeze & high sea
Wind from NE ship on small
sails pump carefully attended.
very two pairs 5 minutes. End of
day. (Lat: 30.31 N.)
(Long: 55-00 W.)

Tues:

May 17th 1921
This day light breeze & clear weather.
all sails set: at 12:40 vitor
saw a lone whale drop down the
boat but don't get it. End of day.
(Lat: 30.32 N.)
(Long: 54-08 W.)

Wed:

May 18th 1921
This day steady breeze & fine
clear weather wind from SE.
all sails set. Saw steamer
bound E. Watch employed in
ship duty. End of day. (Lat: 31.05 N.)
(Long: 54-16 W.)

Thurs:

May 19th 1921
This day steady breeze & fine weather.
Wind from SE all sails set.
at 4:10 a.m. Manuel Brito saw
school of whales drop down the
boat. Third mate got one.
Came aboard got ready cutting
and sent down the gear.
End of day. (Lat: 31.49 N.)
(Long: 54-25 W.) W.B.

Fri:

May 20th 1921
This day light breeze & fine clear
weather wind from SE ship on small
sails. Started to try out at 11 p.m.
Whale very so small. Saw nothing.
End of day. (Lat: 31.56 N.)
(Long: 54-41 W.)

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Sat: May 21st 1921

This day light breeze & fine clear
weather wind from SE all sails set.
Saw nothing. John Perry return
to his duty. Manuel Joquin
and Jose Antonio Segura, sick
of duty with pat. Watch employed
in ship duty. End of day. (Lat: 32.01 N.)
(Long: 54-56 W.)

Sun:

May 22nd 1921
This day light breeze & fine clear
weather. Wind from E all sails
set. at p.m. we saw a large
bat and got him a long sled.
Cut lot fish in it. End of day.
(Lat: 32.51 N.)
(Long: 54-38 W.)

Mon:

May 23rd 1921
This day steady breeze & fine clear
weather. Wind from SE all sails set.
Saw nothing. Watch employed in
ship duty. End of day. (Lat: 32.48 N.)
(Long: 54-09 W.)

Tues:

May 24th 1921
This day steady breeze & fine clear
weather. Watch cruising under
small sails. Saw nothing. Watch
employed in ship duty. End of day.
(Lat: 32.06 N.)
(Long: 53-07 W.)

Wed:

May 25th 1921
This day squally with rain.
Wind from S. Ship on small
sails. Saw nothing. Employed in
ship duty. End of day. No observation.

Thurs:

May 26th 1921
This day light breeze & very cloudy
wind from S all sails set. Saw
nothing. at 6:30 p.m. shot bird down.
End of day. (Lat: 32.46 N.)
(Long: 51-57 W.)
