Tue. May 27<sup>th</sup> 1921  
 p.m. This day fresh breeze & hazy weather. At 5:20 a.m. mate saw school of whales but their went to windward not see them again. At 6:30 p.m. shot - her down hit log. End of day. (Lat: 32.19 N.)  
 (Lon: 67.19 W.)

Sat. May 28<sup>th</sup> 1921  
 This day strong breeze & hazy weather. Wind from S. Ship on small sails. Saw nothing. Watch employed in ship duty. pump carefully attended. End of day. (Lat: 32.96 N.)  
 (Lon: 57.43 W.)

Sun. May 29<sup>th</sup> 1921  
 p.m. This day heavy gale wind from S. Ship on short & sails. at 4 p.m. reef down foresail & forstysail. Sea very high. pumps carefully attended every 2 hours. End of day.

Mon. May 30<sup>th</sup> 1921  
 p.m. This day belauzing very hard foresail got busted finish repairing at 6:30 p.m. set it up. at 7 p.m. do weather. Saw a steamer bound E. pump carefully attended. End of day. (Lat: 32.54 N.)  
 (Lon: 49.48 W.)

Tues. May 31<sup>st</sup> 1921  
 p.m. This day fresh breeze squally with rain wind from S. ship on small sails saw steamer bound E. pump carefully attended. End of day.

(Lat: 33.08 N.)  
 (Lon: 49.48 W.)

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Wed. June 1<sup>st</sup> 1921  
 p.m. This day squally with rain. Ship on small sails. Wind from SW. Saw nothing. Watch employed in ship duty. pump carefully attended. End of day.

Thurs. June 2<sup>nd</sup> 1921  
 This day fresh breeze squally with rain. Wind from SW. Ship on small sails. Saw nothing. Watch employed in ship duty. pump carefully attended. End of day.

Fri. June 3<sup>rd</sup> 1921  
 p.m. This day squally with rain. Wind from SW. Ship on small sails. at 5:25 a.m. John Perry saw two whales same time came very tick we lost them. End of day.

Sat. June 4<sup>th</sup> 1921  
 p.m. This day light breeze & fine clear weather wind from S all sails set. at 4:15 p.m. Antonio spotted school of whales drop down the boat. Second mate run over them mate got away. Came aboard at 7 p.m. make fast the whale & taking on sails. Saw steamer bound NW. End of day. (Lat: 33.09 N.)  
 (Lon: 48.31 W.)

Sun. June 5<sup>th</sup> 1921  
 p.m. This day light breeze & fine weather wind from S all sails set at 2:20 p.m. saw a large whale drop the boat. Third mate got him June board at 7:10 p.m. End of day. (Lat: 33.22 N.)  
 (Lon: 48.26 W.)
