

Remarks on board Scho: Camero master Louis Lopez.

Mon: June 6th 1921

p.m. This day light breeze & fine clear weather. Wind from S. employed cutting the whale & started to rig out. Saw steamer bound W. End of day.

Tues:

June 7th 1921

p.m. This day steady breeze and fine clear weather. Wind from S. all sails set. Employed trying to slow down some oil 5-1 barrel. Saw nothing. End of day. (Lat: 33° 34' N. Lon: 48° 22' W.)

Wed:

June 8th 1921

p.m. This day steady breeze & fine clear weather. Wind from S. all sails set. Saw nothing. Watch employed finishing trying out & wash off the ship. At 6:30 p.m. short-hur down. Let her lay on port-tack. End of day. (Lat: 32° 54' N. Lon: 49° 51' W.)

Thurs:

June 9th 1921

p.m. This day steady breeze & fine weather. Wind from S. all sails set. Saw steamer bound W. At 6:30 p.m. short-hur down. Let her lay on port-tack. End of day. (Lat: 33° 00' N. Lon: 50° 44' W.)

Fri:

June 10th 1921

p.m. This day began with strong breeze & p.m. squall with rain. Ship on small sails. Saw some black fish & porpoises. End of day. (Lat: 32° 29' N. Lon: 50° 57' W.)

Remarks on board Scho: Camero master L. Lopez.

Sat: June 11th 1921

p.m. This day strong breeze & squally. Wind from W. Ship on small sails. Saw school of black fish drop one boat to get one. Struck one. Lost it. Came aboard. Watch employed in ship duty. End of day. (Lat: 33° 23' N. Lon: 50° 22' W.)

Sun:

June 12th 1921

p.m. This day began with light breeze and hazy weather with light rain. At 1:40 p.m. Antonio Antunes saw a large whale off the deck drop down the boat but do not get it. Weather was too squally with rain. End of day.

Mon:

June 13th 1921

p.m. This day strong breeze & very cloudy with high sea. Ship on short sails. Saw nothing. Watch employed in ship duty. Grump carefully attended. End of day. (Lat: 32° 48' N. Lon: 48° 59' W.)

Tues:

June 14th 1921

p.m. This day steady breeze & fine clear weather. Wind from W. all sails set. Saw a sail only. Watch employed in ship duty. End of day. (Lat: 32° 02' N. Lon: 48° 41' W.)

Wed:

June 15th 1921

p.m. This day light breeze & hazy weather. Wind from S. all sails set. Saw Schooner W. Gruber and gave with her she have only 15 barrel of oil. I take from her 3 lbs tobacco 5 lbs coffee 2 lbs boat nails two balls twine. At 7 p.m. short-hur down. End of day. (Lat: 31° 39' N. Lon: 48° 30' W.)
