

Remarks on board Scho: Camero Master Louis Lopez.

Sun: June 26th 1921

p.m. this calm & clear weather. Saw a large white water far away do not make out what it was. End of day. Manuel Jaquein & Jose Antonio Tegu return to my duty well. (Lat: 32.17 N. Lon: 43.26 W.)

Mon:

June 27th 1921

p.m. this day light SW wind & clear. All sails set. at 3.35 p.m. Antonio ~~Antony~~ saw a large white water drop the boats but it was too far. Came back board. End of day. (Lat: 33.08 N. Lon: 44.02 W.)

Tues:

June 28th 1921

p.m. this day steady breeze & fine clear weather. Wind from SW all sails set. at 9.50 a.m. Manuel Berto saw a school of whales drop the boats. Second mate struck one third mate struck iron broke lost it. Came board got ready cutting the whale & set the watch. End of day. (Lat: 33.20 N. Lon: 44.08 W.)

Wed:

June 29th 1921

p.m. this day light breeze & fine clear weather. Wind from W all sails set. Saw some Gramps. At 5.30 p.m. started to lay out. End of day. (Lat: 33.22 N. Lon: 44.21 W.)

Thurs:

June 30th 1921

p.m. this day steady breeze & fine clear weather. Wind from W all sails set. Saw black fish & Gramps. Employed finish tryput. at 7 p.m. shot her down. Put away gun. Startward tack. End of day. (Lat: 33.26 N. Lon: 44.26 W.)

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Fri. July 1st 1921

p.m. this day steady breeze & fine clear weather. Wind from W all sails set. at 7 p.m. shot her down. Saw nothing but Gramps. Watch employed in ship's duty. End of day. (Lat: 33.08 N. Lon: 44.36 W.)

Sat:

July 2nd 1921

p.m. this day began with light W. wind & fine clear weather. At 5.45 p.m. calm & we saw a school of whales drop the boats but it was too late. Boats came back a board. End of day. (Lat: 33.11 N. Lon: 44.40 W.)

Sun:

July 3rd 1921

p.m. calm with big swell from N. Saw nothing. Watch employed in ship's duty. Kill a pig. End of day. no observation.

Mon:

July 4th 1921

p.m. this day light breeze from W. & fine clear weather. All sails set. Saw nothing. Watch employed in ship's duty. At 7 p.m. shot her down. End of day. (Lat: 33.17 N. Lon: 44.51 W.)

Tues:

July 5th 1921

p.m. this day fresh breeze & fine clear weather. Wind from W all sails set. Saw some Gramps. Watch employed in ship's duty. End of day. (Lat: 33.49 N. Lon: 45.08 W.)
